27 Relating to health care facilities; to add Section
28 22-21-437 to the Code of Alabama 1975; to require health
29 care facilities to adopt certain visitation policies; to
30 provide that patients have a right to certain
31 visitation; to allow patients to designate an essential
32 caregiver and to guarantee that caregiver certain
33 visitation rights; to prohibit a health care facility
34 from adopting a visitation policy that is more stringent
35 than certain employee policies; to prohibit a health
36 care facility from requiring visitors to show proof of
37 vaccination or from prohibiting consensual physical
38 contact between visitors and patients; to provide for
39 the circumstances in which patients may not be denied
40 visitors who are not essential caregivers; to require



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41 health care facilities to provide visitation policies to
42 the Department of Public Health; to require the
43 Department of Public Health to develop a mechanism for
44 complaints; to provide certain immunity from liability
45 in certain circumstances; to exempt certain psychiatric
46 care facilities from the provisions of this bill; and to
47 repeal Sections 22-21-430 through 22-21-436, Code of
48 Alabama 1975, relating to hospital visitation during a
49 public health emergency.

57 Relating to correctional incentive time; to amend
58 Section 14-9-41, as last amended by Act 2022-322, 2022
59 Regular Session, Code of Alabama 1975, to reduce the
60 amount of correctional incentive time a prisoner
61 receives; to require a prisoner to remain in a certain
62 classification for a longer period of time before moving
63 up to a higher classification; to provide for additional
64 circumstances in which a prisoner may be required to
65 forfeit his or her correctional incentive time; and to
66 require the Department of Corrections to provide annual
67 reports to the Legislature, the Governor, and the
68 Attorney General regarding correctional incentive time.
