SYNOPSIS:

Under existing law, a nonprofit corporation that is not incorporated pursuant to Title 11, Code of Alabama 1975, that provides water service to the public may be audited one time by the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts.

This bill would specify that the law applies to a nonprofit corporation that provides water service to its members or the public.

This bill would also authorize the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts to conduct an additional one-time audit of a nonprofit corporation if the department suspects fraud or mismanagement of funds.
