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4	SJR ESTABLISHING THE JOINT STUDY COMMISSION ON ADVANCED
5	AIR MOBILITY.
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7	WHEREAS, our system of aviation is now on the cusp of
8	the greatest transformation since the introduction of
9	widely-available jet travel over 60 years ago; and
10	WHEREAS, this phenomenon, designated as Advanced Air
11	Mobility, refers to an entirely new, full-spectrum paradigm
12	for how humanity experiences flight, from drones to
13	passenger aircraft with vertical takeoff and landing
14	capability, to advanced systems that comprehensively direct
15	and manage air traffic; and
16	WHEREAS, this emergent field raises the exciting
17	prospect of short-distance commuting, including "air taxi"
18	service and cargo transport between previously underserved
19	locales and regions; and
20	WHEREAS, the United States Congress has prioritized
21	Advanced Air Mobility, through its enactment in 2022 of
22	Public Law No. 117-203, the "Advanced Air Mobility
23	Coordination and Leadership Act"; and
24	WHEREAS, the State of Alabama would uniquely benefit

from the development and implementation of Advanced Air

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26	Mobility, having rural areas distant from airports that line
27	with continental and international destinations; and
28	WHEREAS, the City of Huntsville has played a
29	leadership role in the advancement of aeronautics in North
30	America, as home to the NASA Marshall Space Flight Center
31	and scores of companies that serve the aerospace and
32	aeronautical industries; now therefore,
33	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH
34	HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the Joint Study Commission
35	on Advanced Air Mobility is established for the purpose of
36	recommending legislation that would ensure that the State of
37	Alabama will be at the forefront of the emerging Advanced
38	Air Mobility field.
39	(a) The membership of the study commission shall
40	consist of all of the following:
41	(1) The Lieutenant Governor, or his or her designee.
42	(2) Three members of the Senate to be appointed by
43	the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, one of whom shall
44	be a member of the minority party.
45	(3) Three members of the House of Representatives to
46	be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives,
47	one of whom shall be a member of the minority party.
48	(4) The Secretary of the Alabama State Law
49	Enforcement Agency, or his or her designee.

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50	(5) Two individuals experienced in aviation or
51	aeronautical design, to be appointed by the President Pro
52	Tempore of the Senate.

- 53 (6) Two individuals experienced in aviation or aeronautical design, to be appointed by the Speaker of the 54 55 House of Representatives.
- (b) (1) The membership of the study commission shall 56 be inclusive and reflect the racial, gender, geographic, 57 urban, rural, and economic diversity of the state. 58
- (2) No later than 60 days after enactment of this 59 60 resolution, the Governor shall call the first meeting of the study commission, at which the members shall elect a chair 62 from among the membership.

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- 63 (3) The members of the study commission shall be entitled to their legislative compensation, per diem, and 64 65 travel expenses for each day they attend a meeting of the 66 task force pursuant to Section 49 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022. 67
- (c) Pursuant to Section 36-14-17.1, Code of Alabama 68 69 1975, the study commission shall provide to the Secretary of 70 State a notice of all meetings, the name of each member 71 serving on the study commission, and a copy of all reports and written recommendations produced throughout the duration 72 of the study commission. 73

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74	(d)(1) The study commission shall meet as necessary
75	to conduct its business.
76	(2) A quorum for a meeting shall be seven members.
77	(3) The study commission may meet by electronic
78	means.
79	(e) The commission's areas of study shall include,
80	but not be limited to, all of the following:
81	(1) The state's existing aviation infrastructure and
82	the steps needed to provide for its participation and
83	expansion in new local, regional, and urban transportation
8 4	systems.
85	(2) Identification of the Alabama companies that
86	serve the aeronautical industry, with the purpose of
87	fostering their contributions to Advanced Air Mobility.
88	(3) The recruitment to the state of innovative
89	companies engaged in some area of Advanced Air Mobility
90	technology or logistics.
91	(f) The study commission shall submit its
92	recommendations on Advanced Air Mobility legislation to the
93	Governor no later than the third day of the 2025 Regular
94	Session of the Legislature, at which time the study
95	commission shall terminate.

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
