

## House Public Safety and Homeland Security Reported Substitute for HB126

6	TO BE ENTITLED
7	AN ACT
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9	Relating to individuals with sensory needs and
10	invisible disabilities; to require fire-protection personnel,
11	certified volunteer firefighters, and emergency medical
12	services personnel to undergo regular training related to
13	interacting with individuals with sensory needs or invisible
14	disabilities; to require fire-protection personnel trainees to
15	undergo the training prior to certification; and to condition
16	the training requirements on the collaboration with a
17	nonprofit entity to provide the training without compensation.
18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
19	Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as
20	the Abram Colin Act.
21	Section 2. (a) This section shall have the same
22	definitions as Section 36-32-1, Code of Alabama 1975.
23	(b) $\frac{(1)}{(1)}$ Beginning January 1, 2025, the Alabama
24	Firefighters' Personnel Standards and Education Commission
25	shall: (i) require each trainee, as a condition for
26	certification by the commission, to complete one hour of
27	training on interacting with individuals with sensory needs or



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personnel and certified volunteer firefighter to complete one hour of training on interacting with individuals with sensory needs or invisible disabilities every other year.

- (2) In the event that the commission fails to implement the training required for trainees by subdivision (1) by January 1, 2025, the training required by subdivision (1) for fire-protection personnel and certified volunteer firefighters must occur annually.
  - (c) (1) The Alabama Firefighters' Personnel Standards and Education Commission shall collaborate with a nonprofit entity that provides training on individuals with sensory needs or invisible disabilities to administer the training required by this section. The entity shall provide the required training related to individuals with sensory needs or invisible disabilities without compensation. The training may be provided in person or online. The commission shall ensure the entity chosen to administer the training annually reviews and updates the training to include changes and trends relating to individuals with sensory needs or invisible disabilities.
  - (2) The training requirements of this section only apply if the company that the commission collaborates with pursuant to subdivision (1) provides the training without compensation.
- 53 (d) The training requirements of subsection (b) do not 54 apply to employees of the Alabama State Forestry Commission.
  - (e) This section shall not be construed to eliminate, alter, or otherwise modify any immunity regarding



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fire-protection personnel or certified volunteer firefighters established under the constitution and laws of this state.

Section 3. (a) This section shall have the same definitions as Section 22-18-1, Code of Alabama 1975.

- (b) Beginning January 1, 2025, the Alabama Department of Public Health shall require each emergency medical services personnel to annually complete one hour of training on interacting with individuals with sensory needs or invisible disabilities.
- (c) (1) The Alabama Department of Public Health shall collaborate with a nonprofit entity that provides training on individuals with sensory needs or invisible disabilities to administer the training required by this section. The company shall provide the required training related to individuals with sensory needs or invisible disabilities without compensation. The training may be provided in person or online. The department shall ensure the entity chosen to administer the training annually reviews and updates the training to include changes and trends relating to individuals with sensory needs or invisible disabilities.
- (2) The training requirements of this section only apply if the entity that the department collaborates with pursuant to subdivision (1) provides the training without compensation.
- (d) This section shall not be construed to eliminate,
  alter, or otherwise modify any immunity regarding emergency
  medical services personnel established under the constitution
  and laws of this state.



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Section 4. This act shall become effective January 1,
