10	13A-7-4.3, Code of Alabama 1975; to further provide for the
11	crime of unauthorized entry of a critical infrastructure
12	facility.
13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
14	Section 1. Section 13A-7-4.3, Code of Alabama 1975, is
15	amended to read as follows:
16	"\$13A-7-4.3
17	(a) For the purposes of this section, the following
18	words have the following meanings:
19	(1) CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE. A system or asset, whether
20	physical or virtual, so vital to the United States that the
21	incapacity or destruction of the system or asset would have a
22	debilitating impact on security, national economic security,
23	national public health, or national public safety.
24	(1) (2) CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE FACILITY. The term
25	includes, but is not limited to, <u>any of the following,</u>
26	including any critical infrastructure located on or in any of
27	the following types of facilities:

72	(2)(3) FRAUDULENT DOCUMENTS FOR IDENTIFICATION
73	PURPOSES. A document <del>which</del> <u>that</u> is presented as being a bona
74	fide document that provides personal identification
75	information but which, in fact, is false, forged, altered, or
76	counterfeit.
77	(3) (4) PERSON. An individual, trust, estate,
78	corporation, partnership, limited partnership, limited
79	liability partnership, limited liability company, or
80	unincorporated nonprofit association having a separate legal
81	existence under state law.
82	(4) (5) UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEM. A powered, aerial
83	vehicle that does not carry a human operator, uses aerodynamic
84	forces to provide vehicle lift, may fly autonomously through

an onboard computer or be piloted remotely, and may be expendable or recoverable. The term does not include a satellite orbiting the Earth or a spacecraft beyond Earth's atmosphere and may not be construed to implicate the provider of a telecommunications link between an owner or operator of an unmanned aircraft system and the unmanned aircraft system.

91 (b) A person commits the crime of unauthorized entry of 92 a critical infrastructure <u>facility</u> if the person does any of 93 the following:

94 (1) Intentionally enters without authority into any
95 structure or onto any premises belonging to another that
96 constitutes in whole or in part a critical infrastructure
97 <u>facility</u> that is completely enclosed by any type of physical
98 barrier or clearly marked with a sign or signs that are posted
99 in a conspicuous manner and indicate that unauthorized entry
100 is forbidden.

101 (2) Uses or attempts to use a fraudulent document for 102 identification for the purpose of entering a critical 103 infrastructure facility.

104 (3) Remains upon or on the premises of a critical
105 infrastructure <u>facility</u> after having been forbidden to do so,
106 either orally or in writing, by any owner, lessee, or
107 custodian of the property or by any other authorized person.

(4) Intentionally enters into a restricted area of a critical infrastructure <u>facility</u> which is marked as a restricted or limited access area that is completely enclosed by any type of physical barrier when the person is not authorized to enter the restricted or limited access area.

(c) A person who commits the crime of unauthorized entry of a critical infrastructure <u>facility</u> is guilty of a Class A misdemeanor.

(d) If, during the commission of the crime of unauthorized entry of a critical infrastructure <u>facility</u>, the person injures, removes, destroys, or breaks critical infrastructure property, or otherwise interrupts or interferes with the operations of a critical infrastructure asset, the person is guilty of a Class C felony.

(e) A person who commits the crime of unauthorized
entry of a critical infrastructure <u>facility</u> while possessing
or operating an unmanned aircraft system with an attached
weapon, firearm, explosive, destructive device, or ammunition
is guilty of a Class C felony.

(f) Nothing in this section shall be construed to prevent lawful assembly and peaceful and orderly petition for the redress of grievances, including, but not limited to, any labor dispute between any employer and its employee.

131 (g) Nothing in this section shall be construed to 132 prohibit the state, a county, or a municipality from taking 133 any lawful action on their respective rights-of-way."

134 Section 2. This act shall become effective on October135 1, 2024.
