9	Relating to agriculture; to authorize the creation of
10	the Agriculture Exhibition Center Corporation to operate the
11	Alabama Farm Center; to create and provide for the operation
12	of a board to govern the corporation; to provide specific
13	powers and privileges to the corporation; to permit certain
14	counties and municipalities to sell property and appropriate
15	public funds to the corporation; to exempt the corporation
16	from municipal ordinances; to exempt the corporation from
17	certain taxes; and to deem the Agriculture Exhibition Center
18	Corporation an economic development organization for the
19	purposes of the Growing Alabama Act.
20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
21	Section 1. (a) The Agriculture Exhibition Center
22	Corporation may be established and created by any number of
23	individuals associated with an agricultural membership
24	advocacy organization filing articles of incorporation in the
25	office of the judge of probate of the county in which the
26	Alabama Farm Center will be located.

(b) The Agriculture Exhibition Center Corporation shall operate the Alabama Farm Center for the purposes of promoting,

- showcasing, and facilitating education regarding all facets of the agricultural industry and advancing agricultural business and workforce development in this state.
 - (c) The Agriculture Exhibition Center Corporation shall be governed by, and all powers of the corporation shall be exercised by, pursuant to the corporation's authorization, a board of directors that shall have five members appointed as follows, subject to confirmation by the Senate:
 - (1) One member appointed by the Governor.
- 38 (2) One member appointed by the Commissioner of 39 Agriculture and Industries.
 - (3) One member appointed by the county commission of the county in which the Alabama Farm Center will be located who shall be a farmer and resident of that county.
 - (4) Two members appointed by the Alabama Farmers

 Federation who shall each be a farmer. One appointee shall

 reside in any county north of or in Pickens, Tuscaloosa, Bibb,

 Shelby, Coosa, Tallapoosa, or Chambers County; and the other

 appointee shall reside in any county south of or in Sumter,

 Greene, Hale, Perry, Chilton, Elmore, Macon, or Lee County.
 - (d) The appointing authorities shall coordinate their appointments to assure that the membership of the board is inclusive and reflects the racial, gender, geographic, urban, rural, and economic diversity of this state.
 - (e) Each member shall serve a term of five years, except the initial members shall serve terms as follows:
- 55 (1) The member appointed by the Governor shall serve a term of one year.

- 57 (2) The member appointed by the Commissioner of 58 Agriculture and Industries shall serve a term of two years.
- 59 (3) The member appointed by the county commission of 60 the county in which the Alabama Farm Center will be located 61 shall serve a term of three years.
 - (4) One member appointed by the Alabama Farmers

 Federation shall serve a term of four years and the other

 member appointed by the federation shall serve a term of five

 years, as determined by the federation at the time of the

 members' appointments.
- 67 (f) The board shall elect a chair, who shall be a 68 farmer, and a secretary from among its membership.
- 69 (g) Any vacancy on the board shall be filled by the
 70 appointing authority who appointed the vacating member. Any
 71 member may be removed for cause upon a majority vote by all
 72 other members.
 - (h) No member may have an interest, directly or indirectly, in any contract for work, materials, or services, or profits therefrom, to be performed under the authority conferred by this act if the member, directly or indirectly, has more than a 10 percent interest in any business, firm, corporation, or profits thereof, furnishing or providing the work, materials, or services.
- (i) The board may appoint an advisory council
 consisting of not more than 10 members to advise the board.
 Advisory-council members shall serve two-year terms and may be
 appointed to additional terms by the board.
- Section 2. (a) The Agriculture Exhibition Center



85 Corporation shall have the following powers:

- 86 (1) To adopt bylaws necessary for the implementation 87 and administration of this act.
- 88 (2) To institute and defend legal proceedings in any court of competent jurisdiction and proper venue; provided, 89 90 however, that the corporation may not be sued in any trial 91 court other than the courts of the county of incorporation; 92 provided, further, that the officers, directors, agents, and 93 employees of the corporation may not be sued for their actions on behalf of the corporation except for actions that are 94 95 unreasonable or known by the individual to be unlawful or are performed with reckless disregard for the lawfulness of such 96 97 actions.
- 98 (3) To plan for construction and development of the 99 Alabama Farm Center on property owned by the corporation. 100 Construction and development may include, without limitation, 101 any of the following:
- a. Buildings to hold offices for use by, and to house or accommodate public facilities of, any governmental entity.
- b. Streets, boulevards, walkways, parkways, parks, or

 other places of recreation.
- 106 c. Monuments, statues, or other structures beautifying 107 the Alabama Farm Center.
- 108 d. Community houses, meeting houses, or auditoriums.
- e. Arenas, convention halls, sports facilities,

 stadiums, hotels or other facilities for use as a transient

 guest housing facility, multifamily housing, dormitory

 housing, food courts or other food venue facilities, any



- facilities that provide for or support any public or private educational institution, and any other facilities related to or incidental to the foregoing.
- f. Music halls, art museums, art exhibits, or other exhibits for the advancement of the humanities and cultural development.
- g. Any other buildings, structures, facilities, and other improvements that the corporation determines are appropriate, useful, or expedient to the center's purposes.

123 (4) To acquire property, both real and personal, and 124 rights and interests in such property, by gift, grant, lease, 125 or purchase.

The determination of the corporation shall be conclusive.

- 126 (5) To accept or receive gifts, bequests, and devises.
- 127 (6) To have and use a corporate seal and alter the seal 128 at its pleasure.
- 129 (7) To appoint officers, agents, employees, and 130 attorneys and to fix their compensation.
- 131 (8) To hire professionals and enter into contracts for 132 their services in designing and supervising the construction 133 of any building, agriculture center, auditorium, arena, barn, 134 convention hall, music hall, art museum, place of recreation, 135 art exhibit, office building, or other structure that it 136 desires to construct.
- 137 (9) To make and enter into contracts and to execute all
 138 instruments necessary or convenient to lease or purchase and
 139 own real or personal property to be used for the furtherance
 140 of the purposes for which the center is created.



- 141 (10) To plan for programs and exhibits in the center 142 for the advancement of the agricultural, cultural, and 143 workforce development interests of the residents of this 144 state.
- 145 (11) To accept pledges of revenues or grants of money 146 from any person or governmental entity.
- 147 (12) To sell and lease its property to any person or 148 governmental entity.
- 149 (13) To enter into financing agreements with federal or 150 state agencies that may require the authority to mortgage its 151 property.
- 152 (14) To plan for programs and exhibits in the center
 153 for the advancement of agricultural and workforce development
 154 interests in this state.
- 155 (15) To enter into long-term contracts or agreements 156 for utility services.
- 157 (16) To accept lease payments, loan repayments, or
 158 other compensation to or for the center or other public
 159 person.
- 160 (17) To invest in bank deposits, U.S. Treasury bills, 161 projects, instruments, real, personal, or mixed property, or 162 any other investments as the corporation may from time to time 163 determine to be appropriate and convenient to accomplish any 164 purpose for which the center is organized, including works of internal improvement, interests in private or other corporate 165 166 enterprises, loans of money or credit to individuals, associations, or other corporations; and to lend the 167 168 corporation's credit, grant public money or things of value in



169 aid of or to any individual, association, or other corporation 170 whatsoever, or become a stockholder in any other corporation, 171 association, or company by issuing bonds or otherwise, even 172 though they may be in violation of Section 93 or Section 94 of 173 the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, if done by the state or a 174 subdivision thereof, notwithstanding the fact that any 175 investment or action may involve the expenditure or 176 appropriation of funds received from a public person. In 177 particular, but not by way of limitation, the corporation may invest its funds, from whatever source, in the stock, bonds, 178 179 debentures, notes, or other securities issued by any person 180 locating a project in this state and may enter into contracts 181 or options, including contracts or options for the conveyance, 182 sale, or lease of property, to any such person and make direct 183 grants of money, property, or services for the purpose of 184 inducing the person to locate a project in this state.

(18) To issue its bonds for the purpose of carrying out any of its powers and to apply proceeds from the sale of its bonds, whether heretofore or hereafter issued, not only for payment of interest thereon prior to and during the construction and equipment of any buildings, structures, facilities, or other improvements being financed thereby, but also for payment of interest thereon.

192 (19) To mortgage and pledge any or all of its

193 properties, both real and personal, or any part or parts

194 thereof, as security for the payment of the principal of and

195 the interest on any bonds so issued and any agreements made in

acquired, and to pledge the revenues and receipts therefrom or from any thereof.

- (b) Contracts of the corporation shall be executed in the name of the corporation by the chair of the board and attested by the secretary of the board. The board may provide by resolution for a different form for the execution of a contract by an officer or agent other than the chair and secretary. A contract, irrespective of its form and of the persons executing the contract, shall not be binding unless the contract is authorized or ratified by the board.
- (c) The corporation may deposit its funds not needed to meet expenses or obligations in any bank or building and loan association, provided the deposit is fully insured by a federal corporation or agency of the federal government insuring deposits in financial institutions.
- (d) In addition to all other powers at any time conferred on it by this section or otherwise by law, the corporation shall have the following powers together with all powers incidental thereto or necessary to the discharge thereof in corporate form:
- (1) To participate: As a shareholder in any other corporation; as a joint venturer in a joint venture, whether the joint venture is to be memorialized contractually or through the formation of one or more separate business entities; as a general or limited partner in a limited partnership or a general partnership; as a member in a nonprofit corporation or limited liability company; or as a member of any other lawful form of business organization, that

225 may be involved in the development or operational activities 226 of any buildings, structures, facilities, and other 227 improvements that the corporation determines are appropriate, 228 useful, or expedient to the center's purposes. In connection 229 with the foregoing, the corporation may elect or appoint an 230 individual to a governing body and enter into contracts or 231 other agreements with other parties for the development, 232 operation, design, marketing, maintenance, and use of any 233 facilities upon the terms as the corporation determines are appropriate, useful, or expedient to the center. 234

- (2) To make or arrange for loans, contributions to capital, and other debt and equity financing for the activities of any other corporation of which the corporation is a shareholder; any joint venture in which the corporation is a joint venture; any limited partnership or general partnership of which the corporation is a general or limited partnership; any nonprofit corporation in which the corporation is a member; or any other lawful form of business organization of which the corporation is a member; and to guarantee loans, issue bonds, or incur other forms of indebtedness on behalf of the corporation, joint venture, partnership, nonprofit corporation, or other business entity for such purposes.
- 248 (3) To create, establish, acquire, operate, or support 249 subsidiaries and affiliates, either for profit or nonprofit, 250 to assist the center in fulfilling its purposes.
 - (4) To create, establish, or support nonaffiliated for profit or nonprofit corporations or other lawful business



- organizations that operate and have as their purpose the furtherance of the center's purposes.
- 255 (5) Without limiting the generality of the preceding 256 subdivisions, to accomplish and facilitate the creation, 257 establishment, acquisition, development, operation, or support 258 of any subsidiary, affiliate, nonaffiliated corporation, or 259 other lawful business organization by means of loans of funds, 260 leases of real or personal property, gifts and grants of 261 funds, or quarantees of indebtedness of the subsidiaries, affiliates, and non-affiliated corporations. 262
- 263 (6) a. In addition to any other authority to enter into contracts, to enter into contracts, agreements, or understandings with any other public and private parties including, but not limited to, the following:

- 1. Design-build, design-build-operate,
 design-build-own-operate, design-build-own-operate-maintain,
 design-build-finance-operate-maintain, or other similar
 arrangements or agreements pursuant to which the design,
 right-of-way acquisition, relocation of structures or
 utilities, construction, financing, ownership, management,
 maintenance, and operation, or any combination thereof of a
 project is accomplished by or on behalf of the corporation.
- 2. Leases, licenses, franchises, concessions, or other agreements for the development, operation, management, or undertaking of all or any part of a project of or on behalf of the corporation.
- 279 b. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the 280 contrary, proposals under paragraph a. may be evaluated and

awarded by the corporation based on qualifications of participants or best value, or both, as evaluated by procedures of the corporation and taking into consideration the best interests of the corporation. Evaluation criteria for a contract procured pursuant to the preceding sentence shall be set forth in the request for proposal for the contract. The contract may also be awarded through any existing procurement authority, proposals, or other means of procurement otherwise available to the corporation.

Section 3. (a) Subject to the conditions, qualifications, and restrictions set forth in subsection (b), the Agriculture Exhibition Center Corporation may borrow money from any person or governmental entity. As security for any money borrowed, together with interest thereon, and any obligations incurred or assumed, the corporation may mortgage, pledge, or otherwise transfer and convey its real, personal, and mixed property, or any part or parts thereof, whether then owned or thereafter acquired, including any franchises then owned or thereafter adopted and all or any part of any funds of the corporation. In a resolution authorizing the mortgage given to secure the payment thereof, the corporation, in addition to its other powers, shall have the power to agree with the several holders of the mortgage to make, enter, and perform covenants and agreements as to all of the following:

(1) The conduct, management, and maintenance of the properties held by the corporation or of the activities, operations, and enterprises then or thereafter conducted by the corporation.



- (2) Insurance of the properties of the corporation.
- 310 (3) Restrictions on the exercise of the powers of the 311 corporation to dispose or to limit or regulate the use of all 312 or any part of the properties of the corporation.
 - (4) The use and disposition of any monies of the corporation, including taxes payable to the corporation under any act of the Legislature and revenues derived or to be derived from the activities, operations, and enterprises of the properties of the corporation, including any part or parts theretofore constructed or acquired and any parts, extensions, replacements, or improvements thereafter constructed or acquired.
 - (5) The setting aside of the taxes payable to the corporation under any act of the Legislature or use of the revenues or the monies of the corporation or reserves and sinking funds, and the source, custody, security, regulation, application, and disposition thereof.
 - (6) The assumption or payment or discharge of any indebtedness, liens, or other claims relating to any part of the properties of the corporation or any obligations constituting, or which may constitute, a lien on the properties or any part thereof.
- 331 (7) Limitations or other evidences of indebtedness or upon the incurrence of indebtedness of the corporation.
 - (b) The power vested in the corporation to pledge taxes to be paid to the corporation or to pledge revenue of the corporation shall not be construed as undertaking or purporting to empower the corporation to pledge any tax or any

revenue if the pledge is prohibited by the Constitution of
Alabama of 2022. It is expressly provided that the corporation
shall have the power to pledge any tax paid to the corporation
or revenue of the corporation, the pledge of which is
authorized by the Constitution of Alabama of 2022.

(c) The powers and authority set forth in this section shall only be exercised if necessary in order for the corporation to receive federal funding or grants for any projects or activities of the corporation.

Section 4. The county in which the Alabama Farm Center is located and each municipality therein may lease, sell, donate, or otherwise convey to the Agriculture Exhibition Center Corporation real or personal property, including park properties, without authorization by election of the qualified voters of the county or of the municipality; and the county in which the center is located and each municipality therein are authorized, but not required, to appropriate public funds of the county or of the municipality to the corporation to be used by the corporation for purposes of this act. The county in which the center is located shall not lease, sell, donate, or convey any property to the corporation, or appropriate any money to the corporation, unless the county commission of that county has determined that the lease, sale, donation, conveyance, or appropriation will benefit the people of that county or municipality to such an extent as to fully warrant and justify the lease, sale, donation, conveyance, or appropriation.

Corporation may permit the consumption of alcoholic beverages any day of the week, purchased from licensees of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board, to be consumed by purchasers within the boundaries of the Alabama Farm Center.

Section 6. The Agriculture Exhibition Center

Corporation and all property in which it may have any
ownership, leasehold, or other interest, direct or indirect,
is exempt from all municipal ordinances and rules, including
zoning ordinances, unless the corporation consents to the
application of ordinance or rule.

Section 7. (a) The Agriculture Exhibition Center Corporation, as a governmental entity, is exempt from the payment of all state, county, and municipal sales and use taxes. The corporation and its contractors shall be granted a certificate of exemption from sales and use taxes by the Department of Revenue as provided in Sections 40-9-14.1 and 40-9-60, Code of Alabama 1975, or other general law.

- (b) (1) Any county or municipal sales and use tax proceeds that are collected by the corporation; a joint venture of the corporation, including a public or private venture of the corporation; or a lessee of the corporation or a joint venture of the corporation, and remitted to a local taxing authority shall be rebated by that local taxing authority to the corporation.
- (2) The county commission of the county in which the Alabama Farm Center will be located, at the time of the formation of the corporation, may opt-out of the requirement to rebate sales taxes collected by a private entity, joint

- 394 (3) The corporation may enter into revenue sharing
 395 agreements with the county commission of the county in which
 396 the center will be located and municipalities therein to share
 397 any tax revenue generated by the corporation outside of the
 398 operational area outlined in the corporation's articles of
 399 incorporation.
- 400 (c) The corporation is exempt from paying all state, 401 county, and local ad valorem taxes.
 - (d) The corporation is exempt from paying any other taxes levied by a county, municipality, or other political subdivision of this state, including, but not limited to, license and excise taxes imposed relating to the privilege of engaging in any activities that the corporation may engage in.

Section 8. The Agriculture Exhibition Center

Corporation shall be deemed an economic development

organization, and the Alabama Farm Center shall be deemed a

site, for the purposes of Article 19A, Chapter 18, Title 40 of

the Code of Alabama 1975.

Section 9. The provisions of this act are severable. If any part of this act is declared invalid or unconstitutional, that declaration shall not affect the part which remains.

Section 10. The Agriculture Exhibition Center

Corporation shall be subject to audit and examination every

two years by the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts

for compliance with this act.

Section 11. This act shall become effective immediately.
