



**House Ways and Means General Fund Reported  
Substitute for HB479**

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A BILL  
TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT

To make supplemental appropriations for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2024, from the Opioid Treatment and Abatement Fund to the entities and for the purposes herein in the amount of \$30,000,000.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from the Opioid Treatment and Abatement Fund the sum of \$30,000,000 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2024, to the entities and for the purposes specified herein:

(1) To the Department Corrections for an initiative to support the implementation or expansion of medication for opioid use disorders (MOUD)-Advancing Medication for Opioid Use Disorders in state prisons, \$1,000,000.

(2) To the Board of Pardons and Paroles, \$5,490,000. Of this amount, \$1,515,000 shall be used for substance abuse disorder (SUD) treatment and services for women; \$2,300,000 shall be used for recovery and facility services, including housing and transitional space for those suffering from substance abuse disorder (SUD); \$175,000 shall be used to expand prevention services; and \$1,500,000 shall be used to



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29 implement a program to streamline navigation of services for  
30 people with or affected by substance abuse disorder (SUD).

31 (3) To the Department of Mental Health, \$20,510,000. Of  
32 this amount \$2,000,000 shall be used for Medicaid State Match;  
33 \$1,000,000 shall be used for residential detox; \$1,150,000  
34 shall be used for prevention and improved outcomes; \$3,000,000  
35 shall be used for the 988 Crisis Line; \$8,060,000 shall be  
36 used for prevention, treatment, and recovery grants;  
37 \$1,300,000 shall be used for a statewide marketing campaign;  
38 \$1,000,000 shall be used for **specialty** courts; and \$3,000,000  
39 shall be used for a veterans pilot programs through an RFP  
40 process.

41 (4) **To Auburn University College of Pharmacy for**  
42 **education and training related to substance abuse**, \$1,000,000.

43 (5) To the University of Alabama at Birmingham for  
44 residencies in psychiatry related to the study and treatment  
45 of substance abuse, \$1,000,000. Of this amount, \$500,000 shall  
46 be used for a residency in Montgomery.

47 (6) To the Department of Public Health for purchase of  
48 Naloxone for distribution to state and local agencies and  
49 entities, \$1,000,000.

50 Section 2. All funds appropriated in this act not  
51 expended in the fiscal year ending September 30, 2024, shall  
52 not revert, but shall be carried forward for the purpose  
53 appropriated.

54 Section 3. This act shall become effective immediately  
55 upon its passage and approval by the Governor, or its  
56 otherwise becoming law.
