

# C4CEJWQ-1 02/27/2024 PMG (H) HSE 2023-3805 House Ports, Waterways & Intermodal Transit Reported Substitute for HB253 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT Relating to the Alabama State Port Authority; to amend Sections 33-1-2, 33-1-3, 33-1-5, 33-1-5.1, and 33-1-5.2, Code of Alabama 1975; to provide that the port authority is a body corporate with the ability to employ non-merit system employees. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: Section 1. Sections 33-1-2, 33-1-3, 33-1-5, 33-1-5.1, and 33-1-5.2, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows: "\$33-1-2 (a) There shall be a state agency known as the Alabama State Port Authority, hereinafter sometimes referred to as the port authority. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, whenever any act, section of this code, or any other provision of law refers to the Alabama State Docks Department, it shall be deemed a reference to the Alabama State Port Authority. (b) The port authority shall promote, supervise, control, manage, and direct the state docks and all other

29 facilities authorized by this chapter. The port authority is a 30 body corporate and shall be constituted as provided in this 31 chapter, and it shall maintain and operate all the 32 improvements and facilities authorized by this chapter." 33 "§33-1-3 The chief executive officer of the port authority shall 34 35 be known as the Director of the Alabama State Port Authority. 36 The director may not have any financial interest in any harbor 37 facilities or property that the port authority or its predecessors have acquired or may acquire or manage, and may 38 39 not have any financial or personal interest in any business or enterprise of any sort which interferes or is inconsistent 40 with his or her duties as director. The duties of the director 41

42 shall be as follows:

43 (1) Exercise the chief executive authority of the port
44 authority, and exercise, consistent with this chapter and
45 other applicable law, all the powers, authority, and duties
46 vested by this chapter or other applicable law in the port
47 authority.

48 (2) Appoint, with the advice and consent of the board 49 of directors of the port authority, no more than 11 50 individuals as executive level employees. These individuals 51 shall be non-merit system employees and may replace current 52 Merit System executive level employees who retire or otherwise 53 leave the employment of the port authority. The director shall 54 fix the salaries of these non-merit system executive level employees giving due consideration to the salaries of 55 56 comparable positions in other states and in private



57 industries. These non-merit system executive level employees, 58 though not participants in the classified service of the state 59 under the Merit System Act, shall be entitled to the other 60 benefits, including, but not limited to, retirement, sick and annual leave, and insurance benefits afforded other state 61 62 employees, except that the board of directors of the port 63 authority may provide and fund an alternate benefit package 64 for them. Regardless of whether the port authority funds an alternate benefit package, the port authority shall pay to the 65 State Employees' Insurance Fund the monthly employer 66 67 contribution as defined by Section 36-29-1 for each of its non-merit system executive level employees. 68 69 (3) Employ, with the advice and consent of the board of directors of the port authority, all individuals necessary to 70 71 the efficient operation of the Alabama State Port Authority, including a secretary-treasurer and other employees as Merit 72 73 System or non-merit system employees, fix their compensation 74 and other conditions of employment and tenure in office, and

75 be responsible for the efficient discharge of their duties.

76 Any non-merit system employees employed under this section,

77 though not participants in the classified service of the state

78 under the state Merit System, shall be entitled to the other

79 benefits, including, but not limited to, retirement, sick and

80 annual leave, and insurance benefits afforded other state

81 employees, except that the board of directors of the port

82 authority may provide and fund an alternate benefit package

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89 (a) All employees and officers of the Alabama State 90 Port Authority, except the director, executive level non-merit 91 system employees hired or employed pursuant to Section 33-1-3, 92 and those exempt under Section 36-26-10, shall be subject to 93 the provisions of the state Merit System law with respect to the method of selection, classification, and compensation of 94 95 state employees. Sections 33-1-5.1 and 33-1-5.2 shall apply to the director and the non-merit system executive level 96 97 employees hired or employed pursuant to Section 33-1-3, including their spouses and dependents; however, nothing in 98 99 Act 2000-598 shall be construed to alter or modify Sections 33-1-5.1 and 33-1-5.2. 100

101 (b) Persons employed by the Alabama State Docks 102 Department on August 1, 2000, shall continue to have precisely 103 the same rights and benefits as they now have under the Merit 104 System and under the State Employees' Retirement System and 105 all other benefits that they had on August 1, 2000.

106 (c) (b) The Alabama State Port Authority may employ port 107 police officers at the Port of Mobile, who shall be employed 108 pursuant to the state Merit System or pursuant to Section 109 <u>33-1-3.</u> Port police officers employed pursuant to this 110 subsection are constituted peace officers of the State of 111 Alabama with full police power and jurisdiction to enforce the

laws of the state and the rules and regulations which may be



113 promulgated adopted by the port authority on property owned by 114 or otherwise within the jurisdiction of the Alabama State Port 115 Authority and the approaches thereto. Port police officers 116 shall meet the minimum standards for law enforcement officers 117 provided by law.

118 (d) (c) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to 119 the contrary, the board of directors of the port authority 120 shall have the authority to may adopt and implement an 121 employee compensation plan applicable to the director, the non-merit system executive level employees hired or employed 122 123 pursuant to Section 33-1-3, and those employees employed pursuant to the state Merit System that provides for 124 125 compensation to the employees solely out of funds of the 126 Alabama State Port Authority in addition to any other 127 compensation payable to any employees under existing law as an incentive for achieving goals specified by the plan. The 128 129 employee compensation plan may compensate Merit System 130 employees in excess of, and in addition to, the normal 131 compensation received by the Merit System employee. The 132 compensation plan shall complement the existing pay plan 133 applicable to Merit System employees.

134 (d) Nothing in this section shall be construed to 135 change, alter, diminish, or amend the state Merit System laws 136 or regulations which shall continue to apply to all Merit 137 System employees employed by the port authority."

138 "§33-1-5.1

(a) The Alabama State Port Authority may establish and
 fund retirement plans for various employees of the Alabama



141 State Port Authority including, but not limited to, those 142 employees who are employed by the port authority under Section Sections 33-1-3 and 36-26-19, those employees who are "exempt" 143 144 under Section 36-26-19, those employees who are employed by 145 the port authority under Section 33-1-16 as locomotive engineers, locomotive firemen, switchmen, and switch engine 146 foremen, and hostlers engaged in the operation of the terminal 147 railroads provided for by said that section, and those 148 149 employees of the port authority who are not otherwise covered under the State Employees' Retirement System and pay the costs 150 151 of the establishment and funding of the retirement plans from the revenues of the port authority. 152

153 (b) The retirement plans and benefits shall be in amounts as defined in individual labor contracts and deemed 154 155 appropriate and desirable by the port authority for the benefit of those employees of the port authority who are not 156 157 otherwise covered under the State Employees' Retirement System 158 and who have been declared eligible for disability or 159 retirement benefits by the U.S. Social Security Administration or under the U.S. Railroad Retirement Act. 160

161 (c) The port authority may establish and fund the retirement plans solely out of the revenues of the port 162 163 authority and may execute contracts to establish the 164 retirement funds and provide the benefits under the plan provided by this section. The general administration and 165 responsibility for the proper operation of the retirement 166 plans and for making effective the provisions of this section 167 168 are vested in the port authority, and the port authority may



169 establish committees as deemed necessary and appropriate. The 170 port authority may designate, appoint, and discharge 171 administrators and trustees under the plans and engage 172 actuarial and other services as required to transact the 173 business of the retirement plans. All of the The benefits to 174 be provided under this section may be included in one or more contracts issued by the same or different administrators, 175 176 trustees, and companies and may cover groups of employees 177 under separate contracts as deemed necessary and appropriate by the port authority. The port authority shall establish the 178 179 plans and shall award such execute a contract or contracts on a basis as determined by the benefits afforded, the costs to 180 be incurred and paid for solely out of the revenues of the 181 182 port authority as the port authority deems necessary and 183 appropriate.

(d) The contract or contracts shall provide for 184 185 retirement benefits for the retired employees of the port 186 authority not covered by the retirement plan of the State of 187 Alabama and State Employees' Retirement System as defined by 188 the rules and regulations of the port authority, on terms 189 deemed appropriate by the port authority. The port authority 190 shall adopt rules and regulations prescribing the conditions 191 under which retiring employees may participate in or withdraw 192 from the plans.

(e) The port authority may adopt and promulgate rules
and regulations for the administration of the retirement
plans.

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(f) The benefits provided for hereunder in this section



197 shall not exceed the retirement benefits provided for other 198 employees of the state under established state retirement 199 plans.

200 (g) The port authority may develop a retirement 201 incentive program for all employees of the port authority who 202 are eligible to retire from state service and who retire prior September 30, 1997. The port authority shall promulgate any 203 administrative regulations necessary to carry out the program 204 in a fair and equitable manner. The costs of any retirement 205 incentive program shall be paid out of the revenues of the 206 207 port authority. Retirement incentive monies paid to an employee shall not exceed a sum in excess of one thousand 208 209 dollars (\$1,000) per year of creditable state service of the 210 employee, which shall be paid in addition to any other 211 benefits or entitlements. An employee choosing to participate in this program will not be eligible to participate in any 212 213 other early retirement incentive program offered by the State 214 of Alabama in 1997.

(h) The port authority shall prepare a cost-benefit analysis for the program and annually on the first legislative day of each regular session of the Legislature submit a report to the members of the Alabama Legislature and the Governor on the financial benefits of the retirement incentive program."

(a) The Alabama State Port Authority is hereby
authorized to may provide and establish a plan of life and
health insurance for the salaried officers and employees of
the Alabama state docks State Port Authority who work full



time for the Alabama state docks port authority and receive their compensation on a bi-weekly basis and also a plan of health insurance for the spouses and dependent children of such officers and employees and to pay the costs and premiums of such life and health insurance from the revenues of the Alabama State Port Authority.

231 (b) Such The health insurance plan may provide for 232 group hospitalization, surgical, medical, and dental insurance 233 against the financial costs of hospitalization, surgical, medical, and dental treatment and care, and may also include, 234 235 among other things, prescribed drugs, medicines, prosthetic appliances, hospital in-patient and out-patient service 236 237 benefits, including major medical benefits, or such other 238 coverage or benefits as may be deemed appropriate and 239 desirable by the port authority. The life insurance plan shall 240 be a group plan with the face amount of such the life 241 insurance coverage on such-salaried officers and employees 242 limited to such amounts as may be deemed appropriate and 243 desirable by the port authority.

244 (c) The port authority is hereby authorized to may 245 execute a contract or contracts to provide the benefits under 246 the life and health insurance coverage provided by this 247 section. Such The contract or contracts may be executed with 248 one or more agents or corporations licensed to transact life 249 and health insurance business in this state. All of the The 250 benefits to be provided under this section may be included in one or more similar contracts issued by the same or different 251 252 companies. Before entering into any contract, hereby



253 authorized said the port authority shall invite competitive 254 bids from qualified insurers who wish to offer plans for the 255 life and health insurance coverage provided by this section. 256 (d) The benefits provided for herein in this section 257 shall not exceed the benefits provided to employees of the 258 Alabama State Port Authority subject to collective bargaining 259 agreements. 260 (e) Regardless of whether the port authority provides, 261 establishes, and funds an alternate health insurance plan under this section, the port authority shall pay to the State 262 263 Employees' Insurance Fund the monthly employer contribution as defined by Section 36-29-1 for each of its full-time 264 265 employees, whether Merit, non-merit, or exempt." 266 Section 2. This act shall become effective on October 267 1, 2024.
