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SYNOPSIS:

This bill makes supplemental appropriations for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2024: from Youth Services Reimbursement Fund for Diversion Programs to the Department of Youth Services in the amount of \$2,243,062, and from the State General Fund to various agencies and entities for a total amount of \$189,733,137.

To make supplemental appropriations for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2024: from Youth Services Reimbursement Fund for Diversion Programs to the Department of Youth Services in the amount of \$2,243,062, and from the State General Fund to various agencies and entities for a total amount of \$189,733,137.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. In addition to all other appropriations heretofore and hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated \$2,243,062 from Youth Services Reimbursement Fund for Diversion Programs to the Department of Youth Services for the

29 fiscal year ending September 30, 2024.

30 Section 2. In addition to all other appropriations
31 heretofore and hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated a
32 total of \$189,733,137 from the State General Fund to the
33 following agencies and entities for the purposes specified
34 below for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2024:

35 (1) To the Legislative Services Agency, \$500,000. This
36 appropriation shall be used to contract with an outside entity
37 to conduct a comprehensive review of Alabama's current
38 policies and procedures governing state employment to identify
39 recommendations that may be taken to incorporate a modernized
40 approach to recruiting, retaining, compensating, and
41 supervising qualified candidates for state employment. The
42 agency shall file a report by January 1, 2025, with the
43 Governor and the Chairs of the Senate Committee on Finance and
44 Taxation - General Fund and the House Ways and Means - General
45 Fund Committee with the results and recommendations of the
46 study.

47 (2) To the Supreme Court for one-time repairs and
48 maintenance of the Heflin-Tolbert building and IT hardware
49 upgrades, \$716,600.

50 (3) To the Legislature for construction of a parking
51 deck related to the new State House construction, \$20,000,000.

52 (4) To the Department of Corrections - Correctional
53 Capital Improvement Fund established in Section 14-2-21(c),
54 Code of Alabama 1975 for prison construction, \$100,000,000.

55 (5) To the Department of Economic and Community Affairs
56 for the Ardmore Welcome Center for the repair/replacement of

57 the rocket based on an approved plan of expenditure,
58 \$5,000,000.

59 (6) To the Emergency Management Agency to replace the
60 Mobile Command vehicle, \$600,000.

61 (7) To the Department of Finance for the State Capitol,
62 \$6,011,537. Of this amount, \$3,022,988 shall be used for
63 building security upgrades, and \$2,988,549 shall be used for
64 repairs to include recoating exterior walls and structural
65 floors.

66 (8) To the Alabama Forestry Commission for the
67 replacement of obsolete equipment, \$500,000.

68 (9) To the Geological Survey for the Core and Sample
69 Repository, \$3,500,000.

70 (10) To the State Industrial Development Authority for
71 site development, \$25,000,000. The Fund shall be managed and
72 controlled by the State Industrial Development Authority and
73 expended to provide grants for the assessment of and
74 subsequent development of sites.

75 (11) To the State Law Enforcement Agency for in-car
76 cameras, body cameras and handheld radios, or other related
77 expenses, \$9,833,000.

78 (12) To the Department of Mental Health, \$9,400,000.
79 Of this amount, \$8,400,000 shall be used to increase staffing
80 levels at Taylor Hardin Secure Medical Facility, and
81 \$1,000,000 shall be used to keep the psychiatric beds
82 operational at Bullock County Hospital while the hospital
83 converts to the CMS Rural Emergency Hospital model.

84 (13) To the Military Department for Armory maintenance

85 and revitalization, \$2,000,000.

86 (14) To the Department of Senior Services for the
87 Medicaid Waiver Program, \$1,672,000.

88 (15) To the Department of Veterans' Affairs for the
89 construction of Dovetail Landing to help veterans transition
90 to civilian life, \$5,000,000.

91 Section 3. This act shall become effective immediately
92 upon its passage and approval by the Governor, or its
93 otherwise becoming law.
