14	1-2-1 and 1-2-2, Code of Alabama 1975, to alter the official
15	coat of arms of the State of Alabama.
16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
17	Section 1. Sections 1-2-1 and 1-2-2, Code of Alabama
18	1975, are amended to read as follows:
19	"§1-2-1
20	Alabama shall have an official coat of arms which shall
21	be as follows: a shield upon which is carried the flags of
22	four of the five nations which sovereigns that have at various
23	times held sovereignty dominion over a part or the whole of
24	what is now the State of Alabama: Spain, France, Great
25	Britain, and the Confederacy Alabama itself. The union binding
26	these flags shall be the shield of the United States. The
27	shield upon which the flags and shield of the United States
28	are placed shall be supported on either side by an eagle. The

29 crest of the coat of arms shall be a ship representing the 30 "Badine" which brought the French-colonists explorers who 31 established the first permanent white settlements European 32 colony in the state. Beneath the shield there shall be a 33 scroll containing the sentence in Latin: "Audemus jura nostra 34 defendere," the English interpretation of which is "We Dare 35 Maintain Our Rights." The word "Alabama" shall appear beneath 36 the state motto." 37 "\$1-2-2 The coat of arms of Alabama as described in heraldic 38 39 terms shall be as follows: arms: quarterly, the first azure three fleur de lis or (for France); second quarterly first and 40 fourth gules a tower tripple towered or, second and third 41 42 argent a lion rampant gules (for Spain); third azure a saltire 43 argent and gules over all a cross of the last fimbriated of the second (for Great Britain); fourth gules of a saltire 44

45 azure, fimbriated argent 13 mullets of the last (for the

Confederacy) pure argent a crimson saltire imposed (for

Alabama); at center in escutcheon chief azure paly argent and

gules 13 (for $\underline{\text{the}}$ United States) arms supported by two

American eagles displayed. Crest: A full rigged ship proper."
