## SYNOPSIS:

Under existing law, each local board of education is required to develop a written policy on student discipline.

This bill would define the role of assistant principal and provide that it is the assistant principal's responsibility to oversee student discipline and administer and enforce the written policy on student discipline.

This bill would also authorize the local board of education to determine how to divide the responsibility if a public K-12 school employs more than one assistant principal.

Relating to student discipline in public K-12 schools; to amend Section 16-28A-3, Code of Alabama 1975; to define the role of assistant principal as including the responsibility to oversee student discipline; and to provide procedures for dividing the responsibility if a public K-12 school employs more than one assistant principal.

29	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
30	Section 1. Section 16-28A-3, Code of Alabama 1975, is
31	amended to read as follows:

33	(a) To fully implement the provisions of this chapter,
34	the State Board of Education shall require each local board of
35	education to develop a written policy on student discipline
36	and behavior and to broadly disseminate them the policy
37	following its adoption. Copies of the student discipline and
38	behavior policy shall be given to all teachers, staff,
39	parents. and students.
40	(b)(1) Beginning with the 2024-2025 school year, the
41	role of the assistant principal at each public K-12 school
42	shall include, but not be limited to, overseeing student
43	discipline and the administration and enforcement of the
44	policy developed pursuant to subsection (a). For purposes of
45	this subsection, the term "assistant principal" refers to any
46	school administrator who reports directly to the principal and
47	is charged with assisting the principal in the overall
48	administration of a school.
49	(2) In the event that a public k-12 school employs more
50	than one assistant principal, the local board of education
51	shall determine how to divide the responsibility to oversee
52	student discipline among the assistant principals."
53	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first
54	day of the third month following its passage and approval by
55	the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
