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A BILL
TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

To authorize the governing body of the City of Trussville, Alabama, pursuant to Section 217 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, to increase, for public school purposes, the rate at which there is levied and collected by the city, on all taxable property situated within the city, the ad valorem tax authorized by Section 216.04 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, and an election held in the city on February 25, 2014, to a maximum rate, for any tax year of the city, which is equal to \$1.99 on each one hundred dollars (19.9 mills on each dollar) of assessed value.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. For the purposes of this act, the following words have the following meanings:

(1) ALABAMA CONSTITUTION. The Constitution of Alabama of 2022, as amended.

(2) CITY. The City of Trussville, Alabama.

(3) CITY COUNCIL. The City Council of the City of Trussville.

(4) SCHOOL BOARD. The Trussville City Board of Education.



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29 (5) SCHOOL FUNDING PROPOSAL. The proposal to increase
30 the rate at which the Special School Tax is authorized for
31 levy and collection to a maximum rate, for any tax year of the
32 city, which is equal to \$1.99 on each one hundred dollars
33 (19.9 mills on each dollar) of assessed value, an increase of
34 up to \$1.29 on each one hundred dollars (12.9 mills on each
35 dollar) of assessed value to be used for public school
36 purposes.

37 (6) SPECIAL SCHOOL TAX. The ad valorem tax authorized
38 by Section 216.04 of the Alabama Constitution and an election
39 held in the city on February 25, 2014, to be levied and
40 collected on taxable property in the city at the rate of \$0.70
41 on each one hundred dollars (7 mills on each dollar) of
42 assessed value.

43 Section 2. The city presently levies and collects the
44 special school tax at the rate of \$0.70 on each one hundred
45 dollars (7 mills on each dollar) of assessed value. Pursuant
46 to a resolution adopted by the city council after a public
47 hearing in accordance with Section 217(f) of the Alabama
48 Constitution, and at the request of the school board, the city
49 has made and adopted the school funding proposal.

50 Section 3. Pursuant to Section 217(f) of the Alabama
51 Constitution and a resolution adopted by the city council
52 after a public hearing, the school funding proposal is hereby
53 approved and the city council may increase the rate at which
54 the city levies and collects the special school tax to a
55 maximum rate, for any tax year, which is equal to \$1.99 on
56 each one hundred dollars (19.9 mills on each dollar) of



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57 assessed value, an increase of up to 12.9 mills on each dollar
58 of assessed value to be used for public school purposes.

59 Section 4. The increase in the rate at which the
60 special school tax may be levied and collected pursuant to
61 this act is subject to the approval of a majority of the
62 qualified electors residing in the city who vote on the
63 proposed increase at a special election called and held for
64 such purpose pursuant to the provisions of Section 217(f) of
65 the Alabama Constitution.

66 Section 5. This act shall become effective June 1,
67 2024.
