5	PROTECT THE UNITED STATES' AND ALABAMA'S SHRIMPING INDUSTRY
6	WHEREAS, Alabama is one of eight states on the Gulf
7	of Mexico whose shrimping industry is suffering an
8	existential crisis due to a market flooded with inexpensive
9	imported shrimp from foreign markets; on April 10, 2024, in
10	a bipartisan effort to safeguard the United States shrimp
11	industry, federal lawmakers introduced the Save Our
12	Shrimpers Act of 2024; and
13	WHEREAS, the act would curb the federal government's
14	ability to fund groups that supply financing to foreign
15	shrimp farmers and to use its influence in international
16	monetary institutions to promote the growth of foreign
17	shrimp aquaculture; this encompasses direct payments, loan
18	guarantees, or any other form of financial aid through
19	International Financial Institutions (IFIs) such as the
20	International Monetary Fund (IMF); and
21	WHEREAS, the act brought to light that U.S. taxpayer
22	dollars are being used to finance foreign shrimp farm
23	operations through IFIs and the IMF; these foreign
24	operations include shrimp farming, shrimp processing, and
25	shrimp being exported to the United States; and
26	WHEREAS, due to the global excess capacity and
27	production of farm-raised shrimp and imports, the U.S.
28	market is being overwhelmed, driving shrimp prices down;

29	with increased fuel costs and record low shrimp prices,
30	American shrimp harvesters are unable to leave port, causing
31	suffering and hardship to the shrimpers and the communities
32	that rely on them; and
33	WHEREAS, while U.S. shrimpers are suffering, foreign
34	shrimp farmers and processors are expanding production with
35	funding from the World Bank; low, government-subsidized
36	prices for these foreign-farmed shrimp prevent a fair and
37	equitable market for the American shrimper; and
38	WHEREAS, further, many foreign shrimp producers have
39	been found to use forced labor and child exportation
40	practices; and in March, India's shrimp industry was accused
41	of mistreating workers and violating quality standards in
42	three separate reports published by U.Sbased media and
43	nonprofit groups; in 2015, a Consumer Reports study found
44	that some imported shrimp were contaminated with anibiotic
45	residues, some of which are linked to cancer and others that
46	are not approved for use in the U.S.; and
47	WHEREAS, this America-first initiative would stop the
48	decades-long use of American tax dollars to fund foreign
49	shrimping operations and ensure a free market shrimp
50	industry in the U.S.; now therefore,
51	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH
52	HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the State of Alabama
53	supports the bipartisan Save Our Shrimpers Act of 2024, and
54	we urge Congress and the Alabama Congressional Delegation to
55	pass this legislation and protect Alabama and other Gulf
56	states who contribute to this important industry from
