WHEREAS, with great pride and special pleasure,
Captain Marion "J.R." Bulluck is highly commended and
congratulated on the occasion of his retirement as Support
Services Division Commander of the Madison County Sheriff's
Office; and

WHEREAS, Captain Bulluck began his law enforcement
career in 1980 upon graduating from the Huntsville Police
Academy and working as an officer with The University of
Alabama in Huntsville Police Department where he earned the
rank of corporal; and

WHEREAS, in 1987, Captain Bulluck transitioned to the
Madison County Sheriff's Office as a Deputy Sheriff; during
his employment with the Sheriff's Office, he built a legacy
of excellence while also building a modern police force;
Captain Bulluck's guidance and expertise led the Madison
County Sheriff's Office to be awarded accreditation by the
Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies,
which is the gold standard in public safety with only five
percent of law enforcement agencies nationwide earning this
recognition; he has been promoted four times within the
Sheriff's Office, each time given more responsibility and
meeting and exceeding goals that were previously

30 WHEREAS, Captain Bulluck is affiliated with several
31 professional and civic boards of directors, including
32 Madison County Commission's Drug and Alcohol Board,
33 Diversity Board, International Associations of Chiefs of
34 Police, National Organization of Black Law Enforcement
35 Executives, and American Red Cross; many of the
36 organizations he is involved with are philanthropic in
37 nature and he generously gives his time and talents to the
38 Wounded Warrior Project, Trail of Tears Project, Shop with a
39 Hero, and Special Olympics; and as Chairman of the
40 Huntsville Jaycees, he was able to fly Santa in via
41 helicopter to see local children; and

42 WHEREAS, over the years, Captain Bulluck has earned
43 22 Letters of Appreciation, a Certificate of Recognition of
44 Service from the City of Madison, and a Commendation Award
45 from Sheriff Joe W. Patterson; Captain Bulluck also has the
46 distinction of being the highest ranking person of color in
47 the Madison County Sheriff's Office when, in 2014, he became
48 the first African American to hold the position of Captain
49 over the Uniform Patrol Division; now therefore,
