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4	HR ESTABLISHING THE ALABAMA-JAPAN LEGISLATIVE EXCHANGE
5	GROUP.
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7	WHEREAS, The State of Alabama and the Nation of Japan
8	are established partners in the global economy, with mutual
9	trade in 2022 between Alabama and Japan reaching nearly two
10	billion dollars; and
11	WHEREAS, Alabama's relationship with Japan transcends
12	purely economic endeavors, with friendship expressed through
13	sister city relationships between Birmingham and both
14	Hitachi and Maebashi, Anniston and Tatsuno, Tuscaloosa and
15	Narachino, Dothan and Sakado, Mobile and Ichara, and
16	Montevallo and Echizen; and
17	WHEREAS, the Japanese Garden in the Birmingham
18	Botanical Gardens is recognized by the government of Japan
19	as an official Japanese Cultural Center, and many Alabamians
20	take a lively interest in Japanese culture through
21	organizations such as Bonsai and garden societies,
22	exhibitions, events such as the Sakura festival in
23	Tuscaloosa, and the Japan-America Society of Alabama (JASA);

25	WHEREAS, students at Alabama universities and
26	colleges have been enriched by visits to Japan for study,
27	including students from Birmingham-Southern College, Samford

University, University of West Alabama, The University of

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- 30 University, The University of Alabama in Huntsville, Troy
- 31 University, Talladega College, and Miles College; and
- 32 WHEREAS, Japan is a bulwark of democracy in a region
- 33 overshadowed by China and threatened by North Korea, hosting
- 34 approximately 55,000 American military personnel on more
- 35 than 80 bases; and
- 36 WHEREAS, in addition to being a regional ally, Japan
- is a key partner of the United States on the international
- 38 stage, collaborating with our nation in many critical areas
- 39 that include global security, development assistance,
- 40 environmental protection, new energy technologies,
- 41 supercomputing, critical materials, and space; now
- 42 therefore,
- 43 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
- 44 LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That the Alabama-Japan Legislative
- 45 Exchange Group is created to pursue friendship and
- 46 cooperation between the members of the House of
- 47 Representatives and the people, government, and businesses
- 48 of Japan.
- 49 (a) The Alabama-Japan Legislative Exchange Group
- shall be comprised of the following members:
- 51 (1) One member of the House of Representatives
- 52 representing the majority party, appointed by the Speaker of
- 53 the House of Representatives.
- 54 (2) One member of the House of Representatives,
- representing the minority party, appointed by the Minority
- 56 Leader of the House of Representatives.

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- 57 (3) Any member of the House of Representatives who
  58 requests membership, with the approval of the Speaker of the
  59 House of Representatives.
- 60 (b) (1) The initial meeting of the Alabama-Japan 61 Legislative Exchange Group shall be called by the Speaker of the House of Representatives no later than December 1, 2024, 62 63 at which time or thereafter the group may elect a chair and 64 any other officers as necessary to conduct the work of the 65 group. Meetings of the legislative exchange group may be 66 convened as often as is expedient, provided that the group shall convene at least once per calendar year. The 67 legislative exchange group may meet by electronic means. 68
- (2) The legislative exchange group shall provide an annual report of its activities to the Speaker of the House of Representatives no later than the tenth legislative day of each Regular Session, along with any recommendations or requests that may assist its work.
- 74 (3) The Clerk of the House of Representatives shall 75 provide administrative and other assistance for the work of 76 the legislative exchange group as necessary.
- 77 (c) The work of the legislative exchange group may
  78 include any educational, cultural, or outreach initiative to
  79 pursue on behalf of the Alabama House of Representatives
  80 with Japan.
- 81 (1) Nonprofit organizations, including the 82 Japan-America Society of Alabama, may be invited to share 83 knowledge and expertise.

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(2) The group may inform the Government of Japan of
