HR\_\_\_ RECOGNIZING THE ALABAMA YOM HASHOAH COMMEMORATION ON  
MAY 2, 2024.

WHEREAS, the Alabama Holocaust Commission will host a  
2024 State Yom HaShoah Commemoration on May 2, 2024, to  
observe the passage of Yom HaShoah; the Alabama Holocaust  
Commission is overjoyed to announce that this year's Yom  
HaShoah Commemoration will be held at the Alabama Department  
of Archives and History; and

WHEREAS, Yom HaShoah was instituted by Israel in 1951  
as a day of commemoration for the 6,000,000 Jewish men,  
women, and children who perished in the Holocaust, the  
largest manifestation of hate and intolerance in modern  
history; and

WHEREAS, there is no institutionalized ritual for Yom  
HaShoah; commemorations may include synagogue services,  
communal vigils, and educational programs; the lighting of  
memorial candles and reciting of prayers for the departed  
are generally featured in the solemn ceremony; and

WHEREAS, Alabamians not only mourn the Jews lost in  
the Holocaust, but the Holocaust survivors who have died  
within the last year will be dearly missed after decades of  
sharing their stories and spreading awareness of the horrors  
they personally witnessed and their memories of those who  
suffered and died during the Holocaust; it was their stories

29 of the brutality of the concentration camps; the tattoos;  
30 the squalid conditions; the forced labor; the hideous  
31 medical experiments; the starvation; and the gas chambers  
32 that drove home the unspeakable horrors they endured; and

33 WHEREAS, American screenwriter and playwright Rod  
34 Serling spoke these words on why humanity must never forget  
35 the Holocaust and why the concentration camps must never be  
36 torn down, "All the Dachaus must remain standing. The  
37 Dachaus, the Belsens, the Buchenwalds, the Auschwitzes; all  
38 of them. They must remain standing because they are a  
39 monument to a moment in time when some men decided to turn  
40 the Earth into a graveyard. Into it they shoveled all of  
41 their reason, their logic, their knowledge, but worst of  
42 all, their conscience. And the moment we forget this, the  
43 moment we cease to be haunted by its remembrance, then we  
44 become the gravediggers. Something to remember, not just in  
45 The Twilight Zone, but wherever men walk God's Earth."; now  
46 therefore,

47 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE  
48 LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That on this momentous occasion of  
49 the Yom HaShoah Commemoration sponsored by the Alabama  
50 Holocaust Commission on May 2, 2024, we recognize and honor  
51 the memory of the lives lost in the Holocaust, the survivors  
52 who have died over the last year, and we honor those  
53 survivors who remain among us.

54 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That events such as this  
55 year's Yom HaShoah Commemoration are vital to ensuring that  
56 Alabamians and the people of the world never, ever forget
