HR_____ OBSERVING ALPHA KAPPA ALPHA DAY AT THE CAPITOL ON
FEBRUARY 27, 2024.

WHEREAS, in observance of Alpha Kappa Alpha (AKA) Day
at the Capitol, we have with us today the South Eastern
Regional Director, Dr. Tracey Morant Adams; and

WHEREAS, the Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority,
Incorporated, South Eastern Regional Director serves at all
levels of the sorority, most recently as Chairman of the
International Membership Committee, spearheading a campaign
to reactivate over 30,000 members; motivated by an
altruistic concern for human welfare, she was initiated in
MU MU Chapter in 1985 and has remained a lifelong active
member since; she has served as Representative to the
Membership, Standards Committees, and the I/E Investigations
Team; at the regional level, her leadership roles include
Operations Chairman, Logistics Chairman, Secretary, and
General Chairman of the 79th South Eastern Regional
Conference; additionally, she is a Charter Member of the
Upsilon Eta Omega Chapter, and a certified Parliamentarian,
Graduate Advisor, and Financial Officer; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Tracey Morant Adams is Chief Community
Development and Corporate Social Responsibility Officer for
Renasant Bank, serving as Executive Strategist for the
bank's DEI framework; her humanitarian efforts have been

29 celebrated by many, including the NAACP; in 2020, she was
30 named one of Savoy's Most Influential Black Executives in
31 Corporate America, and by Profiles in Diversity Journal in
32 2022; her civic affiliations include serving on the
33 Talladega College Board of Trustees; the Birmingham Kiwanis
34 Board; The Women's Foundation of Alabama; Children's
35 Hospital of Alabama; and The Links, Incorporated; she serves
36 on national community development advocacy boards and was
37 appointed by the Governor of Alabama in 2021 to the Alabama
38 Women's Tribute Statue Commission; and

39 WHEREAS, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated,
40 has a 115-year tradition of social action; under the theme
41 "Soaring to Greater Heights of Service and Sisterhood," the
42 International Connection and Social Action Committee is
43 poised to implement the "Advocate for Social Justice"
44 initiative with a robust advocacy agenda; this agenda was
45 initiated during the 2022 mid-term elections with the launch
46 of the "Soar to the Polls" voter engagement campaign; U.S.
47 elections impact policy and funding decisions regarding
48 health care, education, environment, voting rights, housing,
49 public safety, and economics, among other issues; while all
50 votes matter in these decisions, voter suppression is at an
51 all-time high; the "Soar to the Polls" campaign was
52 developed to address voting barriers via a three-pronged
53 approach: Voter Education, Voter Registration, and Voter
54 Mobilization; and

55 WHEREAS, in addition to the "Soar to the Polls"
56 campaign, the AKA advocacy agenda includes: a legislative

57 agenda focusing on mental health among Black mothers and
58 youth; the revival of the AKA Public Policy Conference; AKA
59 Days at the Capitol; United Nations and International
60 engagement; and a focus on increasing Women Leaders in
61 Public Policy; and

62 WHEREAS, the representation of Alpha Kappa Alpha
63 Sorority, Incorporated, in the Alabama House of
64 Representatives includes Representatives Barbara Bigsby
65 Boyd, House District 32; Juandalynn Givan, House District
66 60; Rolanda Hollis, House District 58; and Patrice McClammy,
67 House District 76; now therefore,

69 LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That February 27, 2024, is hereby
70 recognized as Alpha Kappa Alpha Day at the Capitol, and we
