HR_____ MOURNING THE DEATH AND CELEBRATING THE LIFE OF HARRY GIDDENS.

WHEREAS, it is with profound sorrow that we note the death of Harry Giddens of Birmingham, Alabama, on February 27, 2024, at the age of 87; and

WHEREAS, his passing leaves a void in the lives of his loving family, many friends, and the entire community where he was highly regarded; and

WHEREAS, Harry Giddens was born on September 7, 1936; on November 26, 1977, he married Sharon F. Giddens and five daughters were born to that holy union; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Giddens worked for the United States Postal Service until he retired in 1995; he devoted a lifetime to committed community engagement; he served 40 years as President of Brownsville Heights Neighborhood Association; 32 years as President of the Airport Hills community; nine years on the Neighborhoods USA Board on Resource Development; and on the Airport Authority Board; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Giddens, with former Councilwoman Maxine Parker, spearheaded the drive to purchase the land from the State of Alabama that was the former AG Gaston Nursing Home; that land cleared and repurposed for the building of the Brownsville Heights Community Center in 2012; the building

30 walking trail was built around the center; on September 7,
31 2013, in commendation for his hard work, the auditorium was
