- 18 person exposed to asbestos or a representative, spouse,
- 19 parent, child, or other relative of that person. The term
- 20 asbestos action does not include claims alleging ovarian
- 21 cancer.
- 22 (2) ASBESTOS TRUST. A government-approved or
- 23 court-approved trust, qualified settlement fund, compensation
- 24 fund, or claims facility that is created as a result of an
- 25 administrative or legal action, a court-approved bankruptcy,
- 26 pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 524(q), 11 U.S.C. § 1121(a), or other
- 27 applicable provision of law, that is intended, in whole or in
- 28 part, to provide compensation to claimants arising out of,



- 29 based on, or related to the health effects of exposure to 30 asbestos.
- 31 (3) EXPOSED PERSON. A person whose exposure to asbestos

 or to asbestos-containing products is the basis for an

 asbestos action.
 - (3) (4) TRUST CLAIM MATERIALS. A final executed proof of claim and all documents and information submitted to or received from an asbestos trust, including claim forms and supplementary materials, affidavits, medical and health records, depositions and trial testimony of the plaintiff and others knowledgeable about the plaintiff's exposure history, work history, exposure allegations, and all documents that reflect the status of a claim against an asbestos trust and if the trust claim has been resolved.
 - (4) (5) TRUST GOVERNANCE DOCUMENTS. All documents that relate to eligibility and payment levels, including claims payment matrices, trust distribution procedures, or plans for reorganization, for an asbestos trust."

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- 48 (a) Subject to Section 6-5-693, within 90 days after aA
 49 plaintiff who files an asbestos action, the plaintiff within

- (1) Provide all parties with an affidavit, signed under

 basis for each claim against each defendant and stating all of

 the following with specificity:

 - (4) The identity, with specificity, of each and every source of exposure to asbestos that is available or known to the plaintiff or plaintiff's his or her counsel for the exposed person and any person through which the plaintiff alleges exposure, including all asbestos-containing products to which the plaintiffexposed person or other person was exposed, whether from bankrupt entities or otherwise, and all premises at which the plaintiff and the other exposed person were was exposed to asbestos; the.
- (5) The specific location and manner of each alleged exposure to asbestos; the.
- 78 (6) The beginning and ending dates of each alleged 79 exposure; and the.
- 80 (7) The specific connection of each defendant to the 81 alleged exposure to asbestos.
- 82 (8) The name, address, and relationship to the exposed person of each individual who is knowledgeable regarding the 83 84 exposed person's exposures to asbestos.

 86 documentation relating to this the information required by
 87 this section.
 - the plaintiff's attestation as a source of exposure presents evidence that the plaintiff's affidavitattestation is incomplete, the defendant may move the court for an order to require the plaintiff to supplement the affidavitattestation. If the court determines that there is a sufficient basis for the plaintiff to supplement the affidavitattestation, the court shall enter an order to require the plaintiff to supplement the plaintiff to supplement the affidavitattestation and shall stay the action until the plaintiff supplements the affidavitattestation as provided by the court and produces the supplemental affidavitattestation to the parties.
 - (c) The court shall dismiss the plaintiff's claim without prejudice if the plaintiff fails to provide the information required in this section or fails to satisfy an order to supplement the plaintiff's affidavitattestation within 90 days from the time the information is required to be provided to the parties.
