SYNOPSIS:

Under existing law, termination dates are established for enumerated state agencies. The agencies are periodically reviewed by the Alabama Sunset Committee. After the review process is completed, the committee prepares its recommendations for the agencies to the Legislature in the form of sunset bills which either continue, terminate, or continue with modifications each agency reviewed.

This bill would provide for the continuance of the Alabama Behavior Analyst Licensing Board within the Division of Developmental Disabilities of the Department of Mental Health until October 1, 2026, with the following changes: To require the department to provide certain services, office space, and personnel for the board.

- 33 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
- 34 Section 1. Pursuant to the Alabama Sunset Law, the
- 35 Sunset Committee recommends the continuance of the Alabama
- 36 Behavior Analyst Licensing Board within the Division of
- 37 Developmental Disabilities of the Department of Mental Health
- 38 until October 1, 2026, with the additional recommendations for
- 39 statutory change as set out in Section 3.
- Section 2. The existence and functioning of the Alabama
- 41 Behavior Analyst Licensing Board, created and functioning
- 42 pursuant to Section Chapter 5A of Title 34, Code of Alabama
- 43 1975, is continued, and those code sections are expressly
- 44 preserved.
- 45 Section 3. Section 34-5A-3 of the Code of Alabama 1975,
- 46 is amended to read as follows:
- 47 "\$34-5A-3
- 48 (a) (1) The Alabama Behavior Analyst Licensing Board is
- 49 established within the Department of Mental Health, Division
- of Developmental Disabilities. The department shall provide
- all of the following for the performance of the duties of the
- 52 board:
- 53 a. Financial services.
- b. Legal services.
- 55 c. Dedicated office space within the office of the
- 56 State Autism Coordinator.

58	dedicated to the board, and other personnel as necessary for

60	e. Information technology services that shall include
61	one or more dedicated phone lines, dedicated email addresses

64	(2) The board shall consist of seven members, including
65	four licensed behavior analysts, one licensed psychologist in

68	an individual who has received services from a licensed
69	behavior analyst, and one public member, who, except for the

interest in the practice of behavior analysis.

- 86 (b) The initial members of the board shall be board 87 certified behavior analysts, as recognized by the certifying 88 entity, and shall each become licensed as a behavior analyst or assistant behavior analyst, pursuant to this chapter, 89 90 during his or her initial term serving on the board. These 91 initial board members shall be appointed by the Commissioner 92 of the Department of Mental Health upon recommendations 93 submitted by the Alabama Association for Behavior Analysis, the Alabama Interagency Autism Coordinating Council, the 94 95 Department of Mental Health, and any other group determined 96 appropriate by the commissioner. Subsequent appointments shall 97 be appointed by the Governor upon recommendations submitted by 98 the board.
- 99 (c) Any vacancy occurring other than by expiration of
 100 terms shall be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term
 101 by appointment by the Governor, upon recommendation of the
 102 board.
- 103 (d) No member shall serve more than two successive three-year terms.
- 105 (e) A member shall serve until a successor is appointed 106 and assumes office.
- 107 (f) Members shall be paid out of the funds of the board 108 the same per diem as prescribed by law for state employees for 109 each day of attendance of board business.
- 110 (g) The board shall meet at least twice annually and
 111 may meet at—such other times as necessary, at the call of the
 112 chair or by a majority of the members, to complete the

- 114 (h) The board shall <u>promulgate</u> adopt and enforce rules
 115 and establish fees necessary to implement this chapter.
- 116 (i) The board shall investigate all complaints relating
 117 to the practice of behavior analysis by any licensed behavior
 118 analyst, licensed assistant behavior analyst, or any person
 119 individual alleged to be practicing or providing supervision
 120 without a state license.
- 121 (1) The board may fine, censure, revoke, or deny a
 122 license, place on probation, reprimand, or otherwise
 123 discipline a licensee on any of the following grounds:
- a. Conviction of a crime whichthat the board determines

 to be of a nature as to render the person individual convicted

 unfit to practice as a behavior analyst.
- b. Violation of the professional and ethical compliance code or the rules of the board.
- 129 c. Fraud or misrepresentation in obtaining a license.
- 130 (2) The board may summarily suspend the license of a
 131 licensee who the board determines poses an imminent danger to
 132 the public. A hearing shall be held within 10 days after the
 133 suspension to determine whether the summary action was
 134 warranted.
- (3) No license may be denied, suspended, or revoked or

 a person an individual otherwise disciplined without prior

 notice and opportunity for hearing, except that the board,

 without prior notice of hearing, may take action against any

 person individual convicted of a crime listed in paragraph a.

 of subdivision (1) a. No license may be denied, suspended, or



revoked or <u>a person</u> an individual otherwise disciplined

pursuant to this section except by vote of a majority of the

membership of the board.

- (4) Any person may file a complaint with the board seeking the denial, suspension, or revocation of a license issued or pending issuance by the board, or seeking to otherwise discipline a person an individual for any violation of this chapter or rules adopted by the board. Complaints shall be in a form prescribed by the board. If the board determines that a complaint alleges facts which that, if true, would require disciplinary action or denial, revocation, or suspension of a license, the board shall promptly institute a hearing. If the board determines that a complaint does not allege facts which warrant a hearing, the complaint may be dismissed by the board. The board, on its own motion, may institute a hearing for disciplinary action or for the denial, suspension, or revocation of a license.
- (5) Any <u>person</u> <u>individual</u> whose license has been suspended or revoked may apply to the board for vacation of the suspension or reinstatement of his or her license.
- (j) Upon finding that a person an individual governed by this chapter has practiced as a behavior analyst, advertised that he or she performs as a behavior analyst, or utilized a title or description denoting that he or she is a behavior analyst without first having obtained a license, the board may do any of the following:
 - (1) Impose an administrative fine.
- 168 (2) Issue a cease and desist order.

SUPERIOR SERVICE

- 169 (3) Petition the circuit court of the county where the 170 act occurred to enforce the cease and desist order and collect 171 the assessed fine.
- 172 (k) A majority of the membership of the board shall constitute a quorum.
- 174 (1) The board shall elect a chair from among its 175 membership on an annual basis.
- 176 (m) There is established a separate special revenue 177 fund in the State Treasury known as the Alabama Behavior Analyst Licensing Board Fund. All receipts collected by the 178 179 board pursuant to this chapter shall be deposited into this fund and used to the credit of the board for its operation and 180 181 to carry out this chapter. Receipts shall be disbursed only by 182 warrant of the Comptroller drawn upon the State Treasury upon 183 itemized vouchers approved by the chair."
- Section 4. The Legislature concurs in the recommendations of the Sunset Committee as provided in Sections 1, 2, and 3.
- Section 5. This act shall become effective June 1, 2024.
