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A BILL
TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

Relating to Marshall County, to amend 45-48-161 of the Code of Alabama 1975, to provide further for the distribution of in-lieu-of-taxes payments of the Tennessee Valley Authority.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 45-48-161 of the Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

"§45-48-161

In each fiscal year, the distribution of the share of in-lieu-of-taxes payments of the Tennessee Valley Authority for Marshall County shall be as follows:

(1) Twenty-five percent of the total amount allocated to Marshall County shall be distributed to the Marshall County Board of Education, the Arab City Board of Education, the Guntersville City Board of Education, the Albertville City Board of Education, and the Boaz Board of Education, on a per pupil basis based upon the student enrollment of the respective schools on the last day of the first monthly attendance report of each school year.

(2)a. Four percent ~~of the remaining 75 percent~~ or two



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29 hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000), whichever is greater,
30 shall be allocated for the operation of the Marshall County
31 Legislative Delegation Office.

32 b. Any funds not expended for the operation of the
33 legislative office may be used for educational purposes or
34 industrial or economic development projects in Marshall County
35 as approved by unanimous consent of the legislative
36 delegation.

37 (3) The remaining ~~71 funds percent~~ shall be allocated
38 as provided herein and shall be reviewed by the county
39 legislative delegation every four years.

40 a.1. Six percent of the remaining ~~71 funds percent~~ or
41 two hundred ~~thirty-two~~ thirty-two thousand dollars (\$232,000),
42 whichever is greater, shall be allocated to the Marshall
43 County Economic Development Office. These ~~moneys~~ monies shall
44 be used to employ a director and staff and to carry out the
45 operation of recruiting industries and job opportunities for
46 Marshall County and each of the municipalities in the county.
47 The director shall be employed by the Economic Development
48 Board.

49 2. All money previously allocated to the Marshall
50 County Economic Development Board which is accumulated and
51 held in a designated fund for industrial or economic
52 development projects in Marshall County is released for
53 further allocation at the direction of the board.

54 b. Thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) shall be allocated
55 to the Marshall County Commission to help provide for school
56 resource officers in the Marshall County school system.



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57 c. Fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) shall be
58 allocated to the Marshall County Economic Development Board in
59 addition to the allocation in paragraph a.

60 d. Twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) shall be
61 allocated to the Mountain Valley Council on the Arts
62 ~~commencing on October 1, 2006.~~

63 e. Thirteen thousand dollars (\$13,000) shall be
64 allocated to the City of Albertville for ambulance use so long
65 as ambulance service is provided by the city; and twenty-seven
66 thousand dollars (\$27,000) shall be allocated to the City of
67 Arab for ambulance use so long as the ambulance service is
68 provided by the city.

69 f. Fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) shall be allocated
70 to Mountain Lakes Behavioral Health Care, for mental health
71 services, including substance abuse treatment and prevention.

72 g. Eighteen thousand dollars (\$18,000) shall be
73 allocated to the Marshall County Convention and Visitors
74 Bureau.

75 h. Twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) shall be
76 allocated to the Marshall County Coalition Against Domestic
77 Violence.

78 i. Twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) shall be
79 allocated to CASA of Marshall County, Inc., for services to
80 the aging and homebound.

81 j. Twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) shall be
82 allocated to the Marshall County RSVP.

83 (4) All remaining amounts after the preceding
84 allocations shall be paid to the county governing body to be



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85 distributed to the county and municipalities as provided by
86 law."

87 Section 2. This act shall become effective on June 1,
88 2024.
