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9	Relating to the Department of Archives and History; to
10	amend Sections 41-6-3 and 41-6-4, Code of Alabama 1975; to
11	further provide for the composition of the Board of Trustees
12	of the Department of Archives and History; to further provide
13	for the filling of vacancies on the board; and to make
14	nonsubstantive, technical revisions to update the existing
15	code language to current style.
16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
17	Section 1. Sections 41-6-3 and 41-6-4, Code of Alabama
18	1975, are amended to read as follows:
19	"\$41-6-3
20	(a) The department shall be under the control of the
21	Board of Trustees of the Department of Archives and History,
22	which shall consist of one member from each congressional
23	district and the additional members selected pursuant to
24	subsection (b)18 at-large members and the Governor or his or
25	her designee.
26	(b) Two additional at-large members shall be selected
27	and an additional member shall be selected from each U.S.
28	Congressional District. The additional members shall be



29	selected by the board of trustees and their names shall be
30	communicated to the Senate not later than the fifth
31	legislative day of the 2004 Regular Session of the
32	Legislature. Newly selected members shall be confirmed by the
33	Senate in the same manner as vacancies filled pursuant to
34	Section 41-6-4. The board of trustees shall select three of
35	the new members to serve initial terms of two years, three of
36	the new members to serve initial terms of four years, and
37	three of the new members to serve initial terms of six years.
38	All successor members shall serve terms of six years and shall
39	be selected as provided in Section 41-6-4.
40	(c) The membership of the board of trustees appointing

73	(a) The board of trustees respective appointing
74	authorities described in Section 41-6-3(d)and(e) shall fill
75	all vacancies occurring on the board, whether by expiration of
76	term of service or by death or resignation, but the names of
77	all successor members shall be communicated to the current
78	session or the next ensuing regular session of the state
79	Senate for confirmation. If the Senate rejects any successor
80	trustee, the board respective appointing authority shall
81	proceed forthwith to fill the vacancy.
82	(b) A trustee appointed to succeed a member whose term
83	has expired shall serve for a term of six years. A person <u>An</u>
83	has expired shall serve for a term of six years. A persor

84 <u>individual</u> appointed to fill a vacancy occurring by death or



resignation shall only serve out the unexpired term of his or her predecessor. <u>A person An individual</u> whose appointment to the board has been confirmed by the Senate shall serve beyond his or her expired term until a successor has been confirmed by the Senate.

90 (c) The board shall hold at the State Capital at least one regular meeting during every year and as many special 91 92 meetings as may be necessary, and at any meeting a majority of 93 the trustees shall constitute a quorum. The Governor of the state shall be a voting member of the board as authorized by 94 95 Section 41-6-3, and he or she shall, as far as possible, shall lend every encouragement to the success and upbuilding 96 97 development of the department. The director shall be the secretary of the board. The trustees shall receive no 98 99 compensation for their services. Each member of the board of trustees shall be reimbursed at the same per diem and travel 100 101 allowance amounts paid by law to state employees for each day 102 of attendance of the business of the board.

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(d) The board may do all of the following:

104 (1) Adopt rules for its own government and also for the 105 government of the department.

106 (2) Elect a director and provide for the selection or 107 appointment of other officials or employees as may be 108 authorized.

109 (3) Provide for the publication of historical material110 pertaining to the state under the supervision of the director.

111 (4) Control and expend such appropriations as may be 112 made for the maintenance of the department.

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(5) Perform such other acts as may be necessary to carry out the intent and purposes of this article." Section 2. This act shall become effective on June 1, 2024.
