4	SJR ESTABLISHING THE ALABAMA-IRELAND TRADE COMMISSION.
5	
6	WHEREAS, the contributions of Ireland to our
7	civilization have been enormous: through her missionaries
8	and scholars, her achievements in literature and music, and
9	not least in the back-breaking labor borne by her sons and
10	daughters without number who helped build our nation, all of
11	which are the achievements of a people who only officially
12	joined the family of nations 100 years ago; and
13	WHEREAS, Irish Alabamians have left a lasting mark on
14	our state, such as pioneering educator Margaret Murray
15	Washington, faithful witness Reverend James Coyle, and
16	Heisman Trophy winner Pat Sullivan; and
17	WHEREAS, most of the people of both Ireland and
18	Alabama have been well acquainted with scarcity, having only
19	realized some measure of economic abundance in the last
20	several decades; and
21	WHEREAS, as our respective economies increasingly
22	diversify, both the State of Alabama and the Republic of
23	Ireland now participate in the global economy, with the
24	value of Alabama's exports to Ireland increasing nearly 75
25	percent in 2021-2022 alone, while Irish companies such as
26	James Hardie and CHR are investing directly in Alabama and
27	its workers, we believe that our economic and cultural

28 relationship with Ireland should no longer be taken for



29 granted; now therefore,

30 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH 31 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the Alabama-Ireland Trade 32 Commission is created to foster closer ties of friendship 33 between the State of Alabama and the Republic of Ireland.

34 (a) The Alabama-Ireland Trade Commission shall be35 comprised of the following members:

36 (1) A majority member and a minority member of the
37 Senate, to be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the
38 Senate, with preference to be given to any senator who is a
39 member of the American Irish State Legislators Caucus or a
40 sponsor of this resolution.

(2) A majority member and a minority member of the House of Representatives, to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, with preference to be given to any representative who is a member of the American Irish State Legislators Caucus or a sponsor of this resolution.

46 (3) The Chair of the Senate Fiscal Responsibility and
47 Economic Development Committee, or his or her designee.

48 (4) The Chair of the House of Representatives
49 Economic Development and Tourism Committee, or his or
50 designee.

51 (5) The Secretary of Commerce, or his or her52 designee.

(6) An individual recognized for his or her
achievements and experience in international business to be
appointed by the Governor.

56 (7) An individual who is active in Irish-American 57 cultural and civic affairs, with preference for an 58 individual with a history of cooperation in the legislative 59 process, to be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor.

60 (8) An individual active in public higher education
61 who has an interest in Alabama-Ireland trade relations to be
62 appointed by the Chancellor of The University of Alabama
63 System.

64 (9) The President of the Business Council of Alabama,65 or his or her designee.

(10) Up to 11 individuals active in international
trade or business, economic development, and cultural
exchange, to be appointed by the Government of Ireland.

69 (b) (1)a. The appointing authorities on behalf of the 70 State of Alabama shall coordinate their appointments to 71 assure the study commission membership is inclusive and 72 reflects the racial, gender, geographic, urban, rural, and 73 economic diversity of the state.

b. Appointments made by the Government of Ireland
shall be coordinated with the parliamentary liaison to the
American Irish State Legislators Caucus.

(2) The President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall call the first meeting of the commission to be held at a date no later than September 20, 2024, at which the members shall elect a chair from among the legislative membership and assign study and reporting responsibilities to the members.

(3) The legislative members of the commission shall be entitled to their legislative compensation, per diem, and travel expenses for each day they attend a meeting of the commission pursuant to Section 49 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022.

88 (4) The non-legislative members of the commission 89 from the State of Alabama shall serve without compensation 90 but may be reimbursed for necessary expenses in attending 91 commission meetings pursuant to the policies of the 92 respective appointing authority.

93 (c) Pursuant to Section 36-14-17.1, Code of Alabama 94 1975, the commission shall provide to the Secretary of State 95 a notice of all meetings, the name of each member serving on 96 the commission, and a copy of all reports and written 97 recommendations produced throughout the duration of the 98 commission.

99 (d)(1) The commission shall meet as necessary to 100 conduct its business.

101 (2) A quorum for a meeting shall be 12 members.
102 (3) After the first meeting, the commission may meet
103 by electronic means.

104 (e) The purpose of the commission shall be to105 accomplish the following:

106 (1) Advance bilateral trade and investment between107 the State of Alabama and the Republic of Ireland.

108 (2) Encourage mutual investment in the State of
109 Alabama and the Republic of Ireland, especially in
110 infrastructure and human capital.

(3) Promote business, educational, and cultural exchanges between the State of Alabama and the Republic of Ireland.

(4) Take joint action on policy issues of mutual agreement between the State of Alabama and the Republic of Ireland.

117 (5) Address such other issues as determined by the 118 commission.

(f) The commission shall annually report to the Lieutenant Governor and the Speaker of the House of Representatives no later than the third day of the Regular Session of the Legislature on the number of times it met during the preceding 12 months, and shall include minutes of its meetings, with any interim recommendations or requests that may assist its work.

(g) The Senate and the Legislative Services Agency shall provide administrative and professional services as needed to the commission.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That upon enactment of this resolution, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall transmit a copy of this resolution to Senator Mark Daly, Seanad Eireann; Ms. Caoimhe Ni Chonchuir, Consul General of Ireland in Atlanta; Mr. Leo Clancy, Chief Executive Officer of Enterprise Ireland; and Mr. Michael Lohan, Chief Executive Officer of IDA Ireland.
