7	WHEREAS, with special pleasure, we offer joyful
8	felicitations to United States Navy Veteran William Edward
9	"Ed" Cowden, who is celebrating his milestone 100th
10	birthday; and
11	WHEREAS, Ed Cowden was born on May 8, 1924, to Harold
12	and Zettie Cowden in Irvine, Texas, the third of six
13	children; in 1934, the Cowden family moved to Harold
14	Cowden's original family homestead near Remlap, Alabama,
15	where generations of Cowdens had settled since the early
16	1800s; and
17	WHEREAS, Ed graduated from Blount County High School
18	in 1942 and began working with his father at Blair
19	Construction in Birmingham and learned the skills of
20	carpentry and homebuilding; and
21	WHEREAS, in 1943, during World War II, Ed Cowden
22	enlisted in the United States Navy; he was assigned to a
23	Carrier Aircraft Service Unit in Oregon where he served as a
24	parachute rigger and trained with the 151 Bomb Squadron as a
25	rear gunner on an SB2C Helldiver bomber aircraft; he
26	honorably discharged from the Navy in 1945 and returned to
27	the Cowden Homestead where he resumed work in the
28	construction industry; and

29	WHEREAS, Ed married his childhood sweetheart, Evelyh
30	Harrell in 1948, and shortly thereafter he re-enlisted in
31	the Navy serving at the small Naval installation at the
32	Birmingham Airport; he was transferred to Jacksonville,
33	Florida, in 1956, and in 1963 he promoted to the rank of
34	Senior Chief Petty Officer; also while in Jacksonville, he
35	and his wife were blessed with two sons, Jeff and Norman;

37	WHEREAS, in 1964, Ed Cowden was transferred to
38	Andrews Air Force Base outside of Washington, D.C., to
39	assume his new role as Senior Chief Petty Officer; in 1966,
40	he retired from active duty and moved with his family to
41	Pinson, Alabama; and
42	WHEREAS, Ed returned to the construction business and
43	began working with his younger brother, John Cowden; later,
4 4	he established the Ed Cowden Construction Company and
45	manufactured large metal buildings for truck terminals; and
46	WHEREAS, Ed Cowden has been a devout member of the
47	Palmerdale Methodist Church for over 60 years; in 1976, he
48	attended the Methodist Conference meetings at Lake
49	Junaluska, North Carolina, to learn how to manage and lead
50	foreign mission projects; he became a major leader in
51	launching global foreign mission projects for the North
52	Alabama Conference of the United Methodist Church, which at
53	that time had over 100 contributing churches in North

55	WHEREAS, Mr. Cowden, along with Palmerdale Methodist

58	village in Haiti where they built a church and later founded
59	a school that is still in operation today; and
60	WHEREAS, as Ed Cowden draws close to his 100th
61	birthday, he remains very active; he does daily exercises,
62	rides his bikes, and serves in his church doing various
63	projects; he has also started a local mission program called
64	Carpenters for Christ where they build decks for people in
65	need in the local community; and
66	WHEREAS, Ed Cowden has been blessed to live a long,
67	full life; he and his wife, Evelyn, were happily married for
68	68 years until her passing in 2017; together they raised two
69	sons, and now his family has expanded to include two
70	daughters-in-law, three granddaughters, one great-grandson,
