10	13A-10-41, to further provide for the crime of resisting
11	arrest; and to provide for enhanced penalties in certain

13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
14	Section 1. Section 13A-10-41, Code of Alabama 1975, is
15	amended to read as follows:
16	"§13A-10-41
17	(a) $\underline{\text{(1)}}$ A person commits the crime of resisting arrest
18	if he or she intentionally prevents or attempts to prevent a
19	peace officer from affecting effecting a lawful arrest of
20	himself, herself, or of another person individual.
21	$\frac{\text{(b)}}{\text{(2)}}$ Resisting arrest is a Class $\frac{\text{B}}{\text{A}}$ misdemeanor.
22	(b) A violation of subsection (a) is a Class D felony
23	if either of the following occur during the commission of the
24	<pre>crime:</pre>
25	(1) The person brandishes, as defined in Section
26	13A-11-7, a deadly weapon or dangerous instrument.
27	(2) The person's active resistance causes a physical
28	injury to another individual.

29	(c) A violation of subsection (a) is a Class <mark>C</mark> felony
30	if either of the following occur during the commission of the
31	<pre>crime:</pre>
32	(1) The person uses or attempts to use a deadly weapor
33	or dangerous instrument.
3 4	(2) The person's active resistance causes a serious
35	physical injury to another individual."
36	Section 2. This act shall become effective on October
