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9	Relating to paroles; to provide certain procedures for
10	a parole hearing; and to require the Board of Pardons and
11	Paroles to adopt conforming rules.
12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
13	Section 1. (a) The Board of Pardons and Paroles, by
14	rule, shall adopt a minimum amount of time to hear advocates
15	for or against the parole of an inmate. The minimum amount may
16	be increased by the board on a case-by-case basis depending or
17	the complexity of the case and the number of individuals
18	seeking to speak. The board shall allocate an equal amount of
19	time to hear from individual advocates for or against parole.
20	(b) Subject to the time limitations under subsection
21	(a), any of the following individuals may speak for or against
22	an inmate's parole:
23	(1) Any individual authorized by the inmate to speak on
24	his or her behalf without regard to any state license
25	requirement.
26	(2) Any victim of the inmate or the victim's family.
27	(3) Any individual authorized by the victim or victim's
28	family to speak on the victim's behalf without regard to any

- 30 (4) Any law enforcement officer.
- 31 (5) Any representative of the Office of the Attorney
- 32 General or office of a district attorney.
- 33 (c) The members of the board may provide the basis of
- 34 their decision to award or deny parole only if an oral or
- 35 written request is made to the board by an individual
- 36 attending the hearing.
- 37 (d) The Board of Pardons and Paroles shall adopt rules
- 38 to conform to this section.
- 39 Section 2. This act shall become effective on October
- 40 1, 2025.
