4	SYNOPSIS:
5	This bill would provide for the recognition of
6	firearm hold agreements between a federal firearm
7	licensee and an individual firearm owner where the
8	licensee agrees to hold a lawfully possessed firearm
9	for a specified period of time.
10	This bill would also provide civil immunity for
11	a federal firearm licensee who enters into a lawful
12	firearm hold agreement.

17	AN ACT

19	Relating to firearms; to define firearm hold
20	agreements; and to provide civil immunity for federal firearm
21	licensees who enter into firearm hold agreements under certain
22	conditions.
23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
24	Section 1. (a) This section shall be known as and may
25	be cited as the Houston/Hunter Act.
26	(b) For the purposes of this act, the following terms
27	have the following meanings:
28	(1) FEDERAL FIREARMS LICENSEE. Any person who is



- 29 licensed pursuant to 18 U.S.C. Chapter 44.
- 30 (2) FIREARM. Has the same meaning as provided in 18
- 31 U.S.C. § 921.
- 32 (3) FIREARM HOLD AGREEMENT. A private transaction
- 33 between a federal firearm licensee and an individual firearm
- owner where the licensee agrees to: (i) take physical
- 35 possession of the owner's lawfully possessed firearm at the
- owner's request; (ii) hold the firearm for an agreed period of
- 37 time; and (iii) return the firearm to the owner.
- 38 (c) No individual shall have a private cause of action
- 39 against a federal firearm licensee operating lawfully in this
- 40 state for returning a firearm to the firearm owner at the
- 41 termination of a firearm hold agreement.
- 42 (d) The immunity from civil liability provided in
- 43 subsection (c) shall not apply to any action arising from a
- 44 firearm hold agreement if that action is the result of
- 45 unlawful conduct on the part of the federal firearm licensee.
- 46 (e) This section shall not apply to firearm transfers
- 47 made in violation of Title 13A or Chapter 27 of Title 41, Code
- 48 of Alabama 1975.
- Section 2. This act shall become effective on June 1,
- 50 2025.
