9	Relating to civil practice; to establish an affirmative
10	defense relating to the damages incurred while obstructing
11	traffic on a street, highway, bridge, or road under certain
12	conditions; and to further provide for the procedure of such
13	actions.
14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
15	Section 1. (a) In a civil action for damages for
16	personal injury, wrongful death, or property damage, it is an
17	affirmative defense that the action arose from an injury or
18	damage sustained by an individual who willfully obstructed the
19	free, convenient, and normal use of any public street,
20	highway, bridge, or road by doing any of the following:
21	(1) Impeding, hindering, stifling, or restraining
22	traffic or passage on the street, highway, bridge, or road.
23	(2) Standing on or remaining in the street, highway,
24	bridge, or road.
25	(3) Endangering the safe movement of vehicles or
26	pedestrians traveling on the street, highway, bridge, or road.
27	(b) In a civil action in which a defendant raises an
28	affirmative defense under this section, the court, on motion

by the defendant, shall stay the action during the pendency of 29 any criminal action the factual basis of which forms the 30 factual basis for the defense. 31 32 (c) Nothing in this act is intended to apply to 33 individuals or entities that are lawfully working in a manner 34 that may obstruct the flow of traffic, including emergency 35 responders, surveyors, engineers, contractors, or others 36 persons that have a legal or contractual right or obligation 37 to modify, obstruct, or direct a change in the flow of traffic or access to a roadway. 38 39 Section 2. This act shall become effective on October
