4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Under existing law, each law enforcement agency
6	is required to report certain civil asset forfeiture
7	information to the uniform crime reporting system
8	operated by the Alabama Justice Information Commission.
9	This bill would further provide for the
10	requirements of what must be officially published by
11	the commission.

15	TO BE ENTITLED
16	AN ACT

18	Relating to the Alabama Justice Information Commission;
19	to amend Section 41-9-655.03, Code of Alabama 1975, to further
20	provide for the requirement to publish data on civil asset
21	seizures and forfeitures in the state.
22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
23	Section 1. Section 41-9-655.03, Code of Alabama 1975,
24	is amended to read as follows:
25	" §41-9-655.03
26	(a) $\frac{(1)}{(1)}$ Annually, on or before February 1, the Alabama
27	Justice Information Commission, shall submit to the Speaker of
28	the House of Representatives, President Pro Tempore of the



- 29 Senate, and Governor a written report that includes all of the
- 30 following:
- 31 <u>a.(1)</u> A summary of seizure and forfeiture activity in the state for the preceding fiscal year.
- 33 b. (2) The type, approximate value, and disposition of the property seized and forfeited.
- 35 \leftarrow (3) The amount of any proceeds received.
- 36 (2) (b) The summary for data on seizures and forfeitures 37 may be disaggregated by the commission. The aggregate report
- 38 shall also be made available on the website of the Alabama
- 39 Justice Information Commission consistent with the format of
- 40 other reports posted on the commission's website and shall
- 41 contain all civil case numbers assigned in state court.
- 42 (b)(c) The Alabama Justice Information Commission may
- 43 include in the report required under $\frac{\text{subsection (a)}}{\text{this}}$
- 44 section recommendations to improve laws, rules, and policies
- 45 to better ensure that seizure, forfeiture, and expenditures
- 46 are done and reported in a manner that is fair to crime
- victims, innocent property owners, secured interest holders,
- 48 citizens, law enforcement, and taxpayers."
- Section 2. This act shall become effective on October
- 50 1, 2025.
