| 12 | "esthetics" and from regulation by the board; and to exempt |
| 13 | individuals who only provide makeup application services from |
| 14 | licensing or regulation by the board. |
| 15 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: |
| 16 | Section 1. Sections 34-7B-1 and 34-7B-13, Code of |
| 17 | Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows: |
| 18 | "§34-7B-1 |
| 19 | For the purposes of this chapter, the following terms |
| 20 | shall have the following meanings: |
| 21 | (1) APPRENTICE. Any person engaged in learning the |
| 22 | practices defined in this article including, but not limited |
| 23 | to, assisting in the performance of any acts of barbering or |
| 2 4 | cosmetology on the general public under the constant and |
| 25 | direct supervision of a person who has held a valid current |
| 26 | license issued by the board for at least five years, in a sho |
| 27 | licensed by the board. |
| 28 | (2) BARBERING. The occupation of shaving or trimming |

the beard, cutting or dressing the hair, giving facial or scalp massages, giving facial or scalp treatment with oils or creams or other preparations made for that purpose, either by hand or by means of mechanical appliances, singeing and shampooing the hair, dyeing the hair, or permanently waving or straightening the hair of any living or deceased person for compensation, as performed by a Class 2 barber. (3) BOARD. The Alabama Board of Cosmetology and Barbering. (4) CLASS 1 BARBER. A person who only does the following in his or her ordinary course of business: Arranges, cleans, cuts, or singes the hair of any person or massages, cleans, stimulates, exercises, or does similar work on the scalp, face, or neck of any person with the hands, or with mechanical or electrical apparatus or appliance, or by the use of cosmetic preparations, antiseptics, tonics, lotions, or creams. Any one or a combination of the following practices, when done upon the human body above the seventh cervical vertebra for cosmetic purposes and not for the treatment of disease or physical or mental ailments, and when done for payment, directly or indirectly or without payment for the public generally: Shaving or trimming the beard or trimming the hair. (5) CLASS 2 BARBER. Any person, other than a student or apprentice, who performs barbering on the general public for compensation, and who shall satisfy the qualifications and licensure requirements provided in this chapter for a Class 2

barber. For the purposes of this chapter, the term barber,



standing alone, shall be deemed a reference to a Class 2 57 58 barber. 59 (6) COSMETOLOGIST. Any person, other than a student or 60 apprentice, who performs cosmetology on the general public for 61 compensation, and who shall satisfy the qualifications and 62 licensure requirements provided in this article for a 63 cosmetologist. 64 (7) COSMETOLOGY. Any of the practices generally 65 recognized as beauty culture, hairdressing, or any other 66 designation engaged in by any person who performs such on the general public for compensation including, but not limited to, 67 cleansing, singeing, cutting, arranging, dressing, curling, 68 69 braiding, waxing, bleaching, weaving, coloring the hair by hand or mechanical apparatus, the use of creams, lotions, or 70 71 cosmetic preparations, with or without massage, on the scalp, face, arms, legs, feet, or hands, esthetics practices, nail 72 technology, manicure, pedicure, or desairology. 73 74 (8) ESTHETICIAN. Any person, other than a student or 75 apprentice, who performs esthetics on the general public for 76 compensation, and who shall satisfy the qualifications and licensure requirements provided in this article for an 77 78 esthetician. 79 (9) ESTHETICS. The practice of performing acts of skin 80 care including, but not limited to, facials, body waxing, 81 makeup, and general esthetics procedures on the general public 82 for compensation. (10) ESTHETICS/MANICURE. A combination of the practices 83 84 of esthetics and manicure.

| 91 | (12) INSTRUCTOR. A licensee who teaches in a licensed |
| 92 | or registered school of barbering or any branch of cosmetology |
| 93 | and completes any applicable requirements for continuing |
| 94 | education. |
| 95 | (13) LICENSE. A document issued by the board which |
| 96 | entitles the holder to practice the profession listed on the |
| 97 | document. |
| 98 | (14) LICENSEE. Any person holding a license issued |
| 99 | pursuant to this article. |
| 100 | (15) MANICURE. The practice of beautifying or grooming |
| 101 | the fingernails, toenails, adding nail tips, extensions, gels, |
| 102 | or massaging the hands, forearms, feet, or lower legs of the |
| 103 | general public for compensation. |
| 104 | (16) MANICURIST. Any person, other than a student or |
| 105 | apprentice, who performs the practice of manicure on the |
| 106 | general public for compensation, and who shall satisfy the |
| 107 | qualifications and licensure requirements provided in this |
| 108 | article for a manicurist. |
| 109 | (17) MANICURE/WAXING. A combination of the practices of |
| 110 | manicure and waxing. |
| 111 | (18) MANICURIST/WAXER. Any person, other than a student |
| 112 | or apprentice, who performs a combination of the practices of |



| 113 | manicure and waxing on the general public for compensation, |

| 114 | and who shall satisfy the qualifications and licensure |
| 115 | requirements provided in this article for a manicurist/waxer. |
| 116 | (19) NATURAL HAIR STYLING. The practice of cleansing, |
| 117 | weaving or interweaving, extending, locking, braiding, or |
| 118 | arranging the hair without cutting, coloring, permanent |
| 119 | waving, relaxing, removing, or chemical treatments. |
| 120 | (20) NATURAL HAIRSTYLIST. Any person, other than a |
| 121 | student, who performs natural hair styling on the general |
| 122 | public for compensation, and who shall satisfy the |
| 123 | qualifications and licensure requirements provided in this |
| 124 | article for a natural hairstylist. |
| 125 | (21) SCHOOL. An establishment licensed or registered by |
| 126 | the board to teach any or all of the practices of barbering or |
| 127 | <pre>cosmetology.</pre> |
| 128 | (22) SHAMPOO ASSISTANT. Any person who is licensed to |
| 129 | perform only the practices of shampooing, cleansing, or |
| 130 | applying temporary weekly color rinses to the hair of the |
| 131 | general public for compensation, and who shall satisfy the |
| 132 | qualifications and licensure requirements provided in this |
| 133 | article for a shampoo assistant. |
| 134 | (23) SHOP. Any place where barbering or cosmetology is |
| 135 | practiced including, but not limited to, a mobile salon. Only |
| 136 | a properly licensed person, who is not an apprentice or a |
| 137 | student, may operate a shop. |
| 138 | (24) STUDENT. Any person who is engaged in learning any |
| 139 | practice regulated by this article in a school licensed or |
| 140 | registered pursuant to this article, and who, as part of the |



- 141 learning process, performs or assists in any practice 142 regulated by this article under the immediate supervision of an instructor who is licensed pursuant to this article. 143 144 (25) THREADING. The practice of eyebrow removal with 145 the use of a loop made of cotton or any other material. 146 (26) THREADER. Any person engaged in the practice of 147 threading on the general public for compensation, and who shall satisfy the qualifications and licensure requirements 148 149 provided in this article for a threader." "\$34-7B-13 150 151 This chapter does not apply to any of the following persons, activities, or services: 152 153 (1) Service in the case of emergency or domestic 154 upheaval, without compensation. 155 (2) Licensed medical professionals operating within the scope of their normal practice. 156 157 (3) Personnel of the United States armed services 158 performing their ordinary duties. 159 (4) Any public trade school or other public school or 160 school program under the purview of the State Board of 161 Education or a local board of education. 162 (5) Any person individual who only occasionally dresses 163 hair and receives no compensation therefor, or does any other 164 act or thing mentioned in this chapter, without holding 165 himself or herself out to the public as a provider of any practices defined in this chapter for compensation. 166 167 (6) Departments in retail establishments where
 - (6) Departments in retail establishments where cosmetics are demonstrated and offered for sale but where no

| 178 | makeup remover, but does not include manual or chemical |
| 179 | exfoliation, semipermanent lash application, lash or brow |
| 180 | tinting, permanent makeup application, microblading, or hair |
| 181 | removal. |
| 182 | $\frac{(7)}{(8)}$ The licensees of any county or municipal barber |
| 183 | board or commission in existence on August 1, 2013, unless |
| 184 | such board or commission elects, by resolution adopted by the |
| 185 | governing body of the county or municipality, to come under |
| 186 | the provisions of this chapter. |
| 187 | (8) (9) Any person individual who practices as a Class 1 |
| 188 | barber." |
| 189 | Section 2. This act shall become effective on October |
