9	Relating to dogs and cats; to amend Sections 13A-11-240
10	and 13A-11-243, Code of Alabama 1975, to define the term
11	"abandon;" to provide for the enforcement of the crime of
12	abandonment of a dog or cat; to make nonsubstantive, technical
13	revisions to update the existing code language to current
14	style; to add Section 13A-11-241.1 to the Code of Alabama
15	1975, to prohibit a person from abandoning a dog or cat; and
16	to provide criminal penalties for violations.
17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
18	Section 1. Sections 13A-11-240 and 13A-11-243, Code of
19	Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
20	"\$13A-11-240
21	(a) The word "torture" as used in this article shall
22	mean theact of doing physical injury to a dog or cat by the
23	infliction of inhumane treatment or gross physical abuse meant
24	to cause said animal intensive or prolonged pain or serious
25	physical injury, or thereby causing death due to said act.
26	(b) The word "cruel" as used in this article shall

- 29 the following meanings: 30 (1) ABANDON. To forsake entirely or leave a dog or cat 31 at a location without providing minimum reasonable care. 32 (2) CRUEL. Every act, omission, or neglect, including 33 abandonment, where unnecessary or unjustifiable pain or 34 suffering, including abandonment, is caused or where 35 unnecessary pain or suffering is allowed to continue. 36 (c) The words "dog or cat" as used in this article 37 shall mean any (3) DOG or CAT. Any domesticated member of the dog or cat family. 38 39 (4) TORTURE. The act of doing physical injury to a dog or cat by the infliction of inhumane treatment or gross 40 41 physical abuse that causes the dog or cat intensive or prolonged pain or serious physical injury, or thereby causing 42 43 death." "\$13A-11-243 44 45 (a) Any law enforcement officer and any or agent of the 46 a county or the municipality appointed pursuant to Section 47 13A-11-242, having reasonable belief, evidence of, or having 48 found a dog or cat to be neglected or cruelly treated that has 49 a reasonable belief of, has evidence of, or observes a 50 violation of this article may perform do either of the 51 following: 52 (1) Remove the dog or cat from its present location. 53 (2) Order the owner of the dog or cat to provide certain care to the dog or cat at the owner's expense without 54 the removal of the dog or cat from its present location. 55
  - (b) Neither the county or municipality, nor any

- 58 good faith, shall be liable for any actions taken under this
- 59 section, regardless of whether or not the dog or cat is
- 60 returned to its owner after impoundment."
- 61 Section 2. Section 13A-11-241.1 is added to the Code of
- 62 Alabama 1975, to read as follows:
- 63 \$13A-11-241.1
- (a) A person commits the crime of abandonment of a dog
- or cat if he or she, with criminal negligence, abandons a dog
- 66 or cat.
- (b) Abandonment of a dog or cat is a Class A
- 68 misdemeanor.
- (c) This section shall not apply to a person who
- 70 captures a feral cat to be vaccinated, spayed, or neutered and
- 71 then releases the feral cat after being vaccinated, spayed, or
- 72 neutered in the same location from which the feral cat was
- 73 captured.
- 74 Section 3. This act shall become effective on October
- 75 1, 2025.
