27	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
28	Section 1. Section 9-12-125, Code of Alabama 1975, is



29 amended to read as follows: 30 "\$9-12-125 31 (a) (1) Any person, firm, or corporation who engages in 32 the selling, brokering, trading, bartering, or processing of 33 any fresh or frozen seafood, whether on a consignment basis or otherwise, is a seafood dealer and shall purchase a seafood 34 35 dealer's dealer license for a fee of two hundred dollars 36 (\$200) four hundred dollars (\$400) for Alabama residents 37 domiciled for a period of more than one continuous year immediately preceding the date of issuance and four hundred 38 39 dollars (\$400) six hundred dollars (\$600) for nonresidents, except for residents of states which charge Alabama residents 40 41 in excess of four hundred dollars (\$400) six hundred dollars 42 (\$600) for the activity, in which case it the fee shall be the 43 amount the other state charges. (2) To obtain the a license, all entities other than 44 brokers shall have and present proof of a business license 45 46 from the location of the business, a tax identification 47 number, and the appropriate seafood processing health permit. 48 -This (3) A license is not required by nonresident 49 seafood dealers buying from or selling to a licensed Alabama 50 seafood dealer or licensed commercial fishermen when selling their catch to a licensed Alabama seafood dealer nor is a 51 52 license required by restaurants where the seafood is cooked 53 and sold for consumption on or off its the restaurant's premises. Restaurants shall not purchase seafoods from 54 any person, firm, or corporation that is not licensed to sell 55

seafoods seafood in Alabama this state.

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57 (4) If the a licensee owns or operates more than one 58 place of business, then an additional dealer's licenses must 59 license shall be purchased for each separate place of 60 business, providing the location of each. A vehicle used 61 solely for transporting seafoods seafood to or from an Alabama 62 seafood dealer is not considered a place of business. Each 63 vehicle from which seafood is sold to or purchased from any 64 person, firm, or corporation other than an Alabama seafood 65 dealer, is a place of business and shall be licensed under this section. The A seafood dealer shall purchase a license 66 67 for each such vehicle for a fee of one hundred dollars (\$100) three hundred dollars (\$300) per license and the operator of 68 69 the vehicle shall have the original license in his or her 70 possession when selling or buying seafood from that vehicle. 71 Seafood dealers may purchase seafood seafood only from commercial fishermen validly licensed in Alabama, Alabama 72 73 seafood dealers, and any nonresident seller who is validly 74 licensed to sell-seafoods seafood under the laws of that 75 state. 76 (5) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or 77 corporation to sell, broker, trade, barter, or process 78 seafoods seafood as provided for in this section without first 79 purchasing a seafood dealer's dealer license. Any person, 80 firm, or corporation violating this section shall, upon 81 conviction, shall be guilty of a Class A misdemeanor, with a minimum mandatory fine of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for a 82 first-offenses offense, two thousand five hundred dollars 83 84 (\$2,500) for a second offenses offense within three years of



the date of the first conviction, and five thousand dollars 85 (\$5,000) and a mandatory jail sentence of 10 to 30 days for 86 conviction of a third and any subsequent offenses offense 87 88 within three years of the date of the first conviction. 89 (b) The Department of Conservation and Natural 90 Resources shall annually remit two hundred dollars (\$200) of 91 each seafood dealer license fee collected to the nonprofit 92 corporation Sweet Grown Alabama for the promotion of this 93 state's seafood products." Section 2. This act shall become effective on October 94 95 1, 2025.
