**HB461** Relating to the Alabama Educational Television Foundation Authority; to amend Section 16-7A-5, Code of Alabama 1975; to authorize the Alabama Educational Television Foundation Authority to use funds to secure additional funding.

**HB462** Relating to emergency medical services personnel; to amend Section 22-18-4, Code of Alabama 1975, to require the Alabama Department of Public Health to credit education or training acquired in military service toward qualifying for an emergency medical services personnel license; and to delete duplicative language and make nonsubstantive, technical revisions to update the existing code language to current style.

of Revenue and the Alabama Commission on the Evaluation of Services to conduct an economic impact study on the effects of the exemption; to require public posting of the study; and to make nonsubstantive, technical revisions to update the existing code language to current style.
