4 SYNOPSIS:

5 Under existing law, termination dates are 6 established for enumerated state agencies. The agencies 7 are periodically reviewed by the Alabama Sunset Committee. After the review process is completed, the 8 committee prepares its recommendation for the agencies 9 10 to the Legislature in the form of sunset bills which 11 either continue, terminate, or continue with modification each agency reviewed. 12

This bill would provide for the continuance of the Alabama Board of Examiners in Marriage and Family Therapy until October 1, 2027, with the following change: To require that no two board members reside in the same congressional district.

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

Relating to the Alabama Sunset Law; to continue the existence and functioning of the Alabama Board of Examiners in Marriage and Family Therapy until October 1, 2027, with certain modifications; to amend Section 34-17A-6, Code of Alabama 1975, to require that no two board members reside in



29 the same congressional district.

30 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

31 Section 1. Pursuant to the Alabama Sunset Law, the 32 Sunset Committee recommends the continuance of the Alabama 33 Board of Examiners in Marriage and Family Therapy until 34 October 1, 2027, with additional recommendation for statutory 35 change as set out in Section 3.

36 Section 2. The existence and functioning of the Alabama 37 Board of Examiners in Marriage and Family Therapy, created and 38 functioning pursuant to Sections 34-17A-1 to 34-17A-26, 39 inclusive, Code of Alabama 1975, is continued until October 1, 40 2027, and those code sections are expressly preserved.

Section 3. Section 34-17A-6, Code of Alabama 1975, is
amended to read as follows:

43 "§34-17A-6

(a) There is created the Alabama Board of Examiners in 44 Marriage and Family Therapy. The board shall consist of five 45 46 members who are citizens residents of this state and appointed 47 by the Governor. In appointing members to the board, the 48 Governor shall select those persons whose appointments would 49 ensure that, to the extent possible, the membership of the 50 board reflects the geographic, gender, and racial diversity of 51 the state as a whole coordinate his or her appointments to 52 assure the board's membership is inclusive and reflects the 53 racial gender, geographic, urban, rural, and economic 54 diversity of the state. Commencing on June 1, 2025, as the terms of the members serving on the board expire, the 55 56 membership of the board shall be appointed so that no two



57 members of the board reside in the same congressional

58 <u>district.</u> The board shall perform the duties and have the 59 powers as prescribed and conferred by this chapter. No member 60 of the board shall be civilly liable for any act performed in 61 good faith for the performance of his or her duties as a 62 member of the board.

63 (b) The professional membership of the board shall be64 licensed pursuant to this chapter.

(c) Vacancies on the board shall be filled for the
remainder of the unexpired term. Members of the board shall
serve until their successors are appointed and have qualified.
Board members shall be ineligible for reappointment for a
period of three years following completion of their five-year
term.

71 (d) Appointments to the board shall be made by the Governor as provided in this subsection. Not later than 72 73 October 1 of each year, the Board of Directors of the Alabama 74 Association for Marriage and Family Therapy shall submit to 75 the Governor the names of two qualified candidates for each 76 position on the board to be vacated by reason of expiration of 77 a term of office. From the two candidates, the Governor shall 78 appoint one member to serve on the board for a term of five 79 years. Other vacancies occurring on the board shall be filled 80 for the unexpired term by appointment of the Governor from two 81 candidates for each vacancy submitted by the Alabama 82 Association for Marriage and Family Therapy within 30 days after the vacancy occurs. Composition of the board shall 83 84 consist of one public member, one marriage and family therapy



85 educator, and three practicing marriage and family therapists.

86 (e) The Governor may remove a member of the board only for neglect of duty, malfeasance, or conviction of a felony or 87 88 crime of moral turpitude while in office. Notwithstanding the 89 foregoing, no member may be removed until after a public 90 hearing of the charges against him or her, and at least 30 91 days' prior written notice to the accused member of the 92 charges against him or her and of the date fixed for the 93 hearing. No board member shall participate in any matter before the board in which he or she has a pecuniary interest, 94 95 personal bias, or other similar conflict of interest." Section 4. The Legislature concurs in the 96 97 recommendation of the Sunset Committee as provided in Sections

98 1, 2, and 3.

99 Section 5. This act shall become effective on June 1, 100 2025.
