## Senate Bill 140

**Senate Bill 140** as reported by the Committee on Education Policy would increase the obligations of the Alabama Department of Public Health (ADPH) to implement, administer, and enforce compliance of youth athletic associations with the Coach Safely Act, by the following amounts: (1) an undetermined amount for salaries and benefits and other personnel related expenditures dependent on the method (digitally or in-person) chosen by ADPH to enforce compliance; (2) a department estimated \$85,000 for the first year, and \$35,000 annually thereafter, to develop a compliance tracking system to monitor the associations for compliance; and (3) a department estimated \$50,000 annually to print, mail and distribute noncompliance notifications.

In addition, this bill could increase receipts by an undetermined amount to the State General Fund dependent on the number of youth athletic associations that are noncompliant for three consecutive years and are assessed a fine equal to 10% of the their total revenues reported to the IRS.
