Senate Bill 140 as passed the Committee on Children and Senior Advocacy would increase the obligations of the Alabama Department of Public Health (ADPH) to enforce compliance of youth athletic associations with the existing Coach Safely Act, by the following amounts: (1) an undetermined amount for personnel-related expenditures, dependent on the method (digitally or in-person) chosen by ADPH to enforce compliance; (2) a department-estimated \$85,000 for the first year, and \$35,000 annually thereafter, to develop a compliance tracking system to monitor compliance; and (3) a department-estimated \$50,000 annually to print and distribute noncompliance notifications.

In addition, this bill could increase receipts to the State General Fund by an undetermined amount dependent on the number of youth athletic associations that are assessed a fine as follows: (1) \$200 dollars for those associations that have less than 100 coaches, or (2) \$10 per coach for those associations with 100 or more coaches.
