1 Enrolled, An Act,

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- Relating to the Alabama Sunset Law; to continue the
 existence and functioning of the State Board of Podiatry until
 Cotober 1, 2029, with certain modifications; to amend Section
 34-24-250, Code of Alabama 1975, to require that a board
- 7 member resides in and be appointed from each congressional
- 8 district in this state.
- 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
- 10 Section 1. Pursuant to the Alabama Sunset Law, the
- 11 Sunset Committee recommends the continuance of the State Board
- of Podiatry until October 1, 2029, with additional
- 13 recommendation for statutory change as set out in Section 3.
- 14 Section 2. The existence and functioning of the State
- 15 Board of Podiatry, created and functioning pursuant to
- Sections 34-24-230 to 34-24-276, inclusive, Code of Alabama
- 17 1975, is continued until October 1, 2029, and those code
- 18 sections are expressly preserved.
- 19 Section 3. Section 34-24-250, Code of Alabama 1975, is
- 20 amended to read as follows:
- 21 "\$34-24-250
- (a) The Governor of Alabama shall appoint a State Board
- of Podiatry consisting of seven-persons individuals, each of
- 24 whom shall be a citizen of the United States and a resident of
- 25 Alabama, over the age of 25, and shall have been engaged in
- 26 the actual continuous practice of podiatry in the State of
- 27 Alabama for at least five years next preceding his or her
- 28 appointment. One member of the board shall be appointed each



29 year, with the exception of three members being appointed 30 every fifth year starting in 1979, for terms of five years and 31 until their successors are appointed and qualified. No member 32 of the board shall be reappointed for a successive term. 33 Previous board members are eligible for nonsuccessive appointments. The Governor may remove from office at any time 34 35 any member of the board for neglect of duty, incompetency, 36 improper or unprofessional conduct, or when the license or certificate of any member has been suspended or revoked. 37 Vacancies on the board shall be filled by appointment by the 38 39 Governor in the manner provided in this section. The Governor shall furnish each member of the board at the time of 40 appointment a certificate of appointment, and the appointee 41 42 shall qualify by taking the usual oath of office before the 43 judge of probate of his or her home county within 15 days from 44 the date of appointment. (b) After April 6, 1993, each vacant office occurring 45 46 shall be first offered to each available black licensee until a black member is appointed to the board. When a black member 47 48 is appointed to the board, thereafter appointments shall be 49 made in such a manner as to ensure at least one black member 50 on the board at all times, and the membership of the board 51 shall be inclusive and reflect the racial, gender, geographic, 52 urban/rural urban, rural, and economic diversity of the state.

53 Commencing on June 1, 2025, as the terms of the members

54 serving on the board expire, the membership of the board shall

be appointed so that one member resides in and is appointed

from each congressional district in this state."

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Section 4. The Legislature concurs in the
recommendation of the Sunset Committee as provided in Sections
1, 2, and 3.
Section 5. This act shall become effective on June 1,
2025.
