8	AN ACT
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10	Relating to the Alabama Sunset Law; to continue the
11	existence and functioning of the Home Builders Licensure Board
12	until October 1, 2029, with certain modifications; to amend
13	Section 34-14A-3, Code of Alabama 1975, to require that a
14	board member resides in and be appointed from each
15	congressional district in this state and that any remaining
16	members be appointed from the state at-large.
17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
18	Section 1. Pursuant to the Alabama Sunset Law, the
19	Sunset Committee recommends the continuance of the Home
20	Builders Licensure Board until October 1, 2029, with
21	additional recommendation for statutory change as set out in
22	Section 3.
23	Section 2. The existence and functioning of the Home
24	Builders Licensure Board, created and functioning pursuant to
25	Sections 34-14A-1 to 34-14A-83, inclusive, Code of Alabama
26	1975, is continued until October 1, 2029, and those code
27	sections are expressly preserved.
28	Section 3. Section 34-14A-3, Code of Alabama 1975, is

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29 amended to read as follows:

30 "\$34-14A-3

- 31 <u>(a)</u> There is established the Home Builders Licensure
 32 Board to regulate the residential home building and
 33 residential construction industry and to promote and expend
 34 funds for the education and support of associated construction
 35 trades.
 - (b) The board shall have nine members who shall be appointed as follows: Three by the Governor, three by the Lieutenant Governor, and three by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, from a list of three qualified individuals for each position, provided by the governing body of the Home Builders Association of Alabama.
 - (c) Seven of the members shall be residential home builders, as defined in this chapter, with at least five years' experience as a residential home builder, and each shall be a bona fide resident of the State of Alabama. One member shall be a building official or inspector currently employed by a city, county, or state governmental entity and actively engaged in inspecting or regulating residential construction in this state. One shall be a consumer member of the general public not employed by or affiliated with a licensee hereunder, and who has no spouse or immediate family member employed by or affiliated with a licensee hereunder.
 - (d) Each member of the board shall be a citizen
 resident of this state, and the membership of the board shall
 be inclusive and reflect the racial, gender, geographic,
 urban/rural urban, rural, and economic diversity of the state.

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57	Commencing on June 1, 2025, as the terms of the members
58	serving on the board expire, the membership of the board shall
59	be appointed so that one member resides in and is appointed
60	from each congressional district in this state with the
61	remaining members being appointed from the state at-large.
62	(e) Of the initial members of this board, the
63	appointing authorities shall designate that each appointee
64	shall serve for an initial term of one, two, or three years,
65	their terms of office expiring on December 31 of the years.
66	Subsequent terms shall be for a period of three years.
67	(f) This The respective appointing authority shall make
68	an appointment to fill a vacancy for the remainder of any
69	unexpired term from a list of three qualified persons
70	individuals supplied by the governing body of the Home
71	Builders Association of Alabama. Each board member shall hold
72	over after the expiration of his or her term until his or her
73	successor shall be duly appointed and qualified."
7 4	Section 4. The Legislature concurs in the
75	recommendation of the Sunset Committee as provided in Sections
76	1, 2, and 3.
77	Section 5. This act shall become effective on June 1,
