7	TO BE ENTITLED
8	AN ACT
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10	Relating to the Alabama Sunset Law; to continue the
11	existence and functioning of the Alabama Licensure Board for
12	Interpreters and Transliterators until October 1, 2027, with
13	certain modifications; to amend Section 34-16-4, Code of
14	Alabama 1975, to require that a board member resides in and be
15	appointed from each congressional district in this state and
16	that any remaining members be appointed from the state
17	at-large.
18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
19	Section 1. Pursuant to the Alabama Sunset Law, the
20	Sunset Committee recommends the continuance of the Alabama
21	Licensure Board for Interpreters and Transliterators until
22	October 1, 2027, with additional recommendation for statutory
23	change as set out in Section 3.
24	Section 2. The existence and functioning of the Alabama
25	Licensure Board for Interpreters and Transliterators, created
26	and functioning pursuant to Sections 34-16-1 to 34-16-16,
27	inclusive, Code of Alabama 1975, is continued until October 1,
28	2027, and those code sections are expressly preserved.



- Section 3. Section 34-16-4, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:
- 31 "\$34-16-4

- 32 (a) There is created the Alabama Licensure Board for 33 Interpreters and Transliterators.
- 34 (b) The board shall consist of nine members appointed 35 by the Governor as follows:
  - (1) Four members certified as interpreters or transliterators at a professional level by a nationally recognized certification, one of whom shall work in an educational setting. A list of three nominations for each of these positions shall be submitted to the Governor by ALRID.
  - (2) Three deaf or hard of hearing members who are knowledgeable in the field of professional interpreting. A list of three nominations for each of these positions shall be submitted to the Governor by AAD.
  - (3) Two members at-large who have an interest in and are experienced in dealing with issues that affect the deaf, hard of hearing, and interpreting communities.
  - (c) All members of the board shall be citizens of the United States and <u>residents of</u> the State of Alabama. In appointing members to the board, the nominating organizations and the Governor, to the extent possible, shall select those <u>persons individuals</u> whose appointments ensure that the membership of the board is inclusive and reflects the racial, gender, geographic, <u>urban/rural urban, rural</u>, and economic diversity of the state. <u>Commencing on June 1, 2025</u>, as the terms of the members serving on the board expire, the



- 57 membership of the board shall be appointed so that one member
- resides in and is appointed from each congressional district
- in this state with the remaining members being appointed from
- 60 the state at-large.
- (d) A list of three nominees for each position, except
- for the at-large positions, shall be submitted to the Governor
- by the designated organizations by October 1, 1998. The
- 64 initial terms shall begin January 1, 1999.
- (e) The initial members of the board shall serve the
- 66 following terms as designated by the Governor:
- (1) Four of the initial members shall serve for two
- 68 years.
- 69 (2) Three of the initial members shall serve for three
- 70 years.
- 71 (3) Two of the initial members shall serve for four
- 72 years.
- 73 (f) Subsequent terms of office shall be four years. No
- 74 board member may serve more than two consecutive terms. In the
- 75 event of a vacancy, the Governor shall fill the vacancy from
- 76 the remaining names on the list of nominees for that position.
- 77 Each board member shall serve until his or her successor is
- 78 duly appointed and qualified.
- 79 (g) At its first meeting each year, the board shall
- 80 elect a chair, a vice chair, and a secretary. No member shall
- 81 be elected to serve more than two consecutive years in the
- 82 same office.
- 83 (h) After the initial appointments to the board are
- 84 made, the board shall meet by January 31 of the following year



- 85 for the purpose of organizing and transacting business as may
- properly come before the board. Subsequently, the board shall
- 87 meet not less than twice annually, and as frequently as it
- deems necessary, at such time and places as it designates. A
- 89 quorum necessary to transact business shall consist of five of
- 90 the members of the board.
- 91 (i) The board shall have all of the following duties:
- 92 (1) Act on matters concerning licensure and permitting,
- 93 and the process of granting, suspending, reinstating, and
- 94 revoking a license or permit.
- 95 (2) Set a fee schedule for granting licenses and
- 96 permits, for renewing licenses and permits, for reinstating a
- 97 lapsed license or permit, and for assessing penalties for late
- 98 renewal. The fees shall be sufficient to cover the cost of the
- 99 continued operation and administration of the board.
- 100 (3) Develop a mechanism for processing applications for
- 101 licenses, permits, and renewals.
- 102 (4) Establish a procedure to enable the investigation
- 103 of complaints concerning the violation of ethical practices
- 104 for licensed or permitted interpreters.
- 105 (5) Maintain a current register of licensed
- 106 interpreters and a current register of permitted interpreters.
- 107 These registers shall be matters of public record.
- 108 (6) Maintain a complete record of all board
- 109 proceedings.
- 110 (7) Submit an annual report detailing the proceedings
- 111 of the board to the Governor and file a copy with the
- 112 Secretary of State.



113 (8) Adopt continuing education requirements no later 114 than October 1 of the year in which the initial board is 115 appointed. These requirements shall be implemented by January 116 1 of the year following for renewal of a license or permit. 117 (j) Board members shall receive the same travel 118 expenses and per diem as state employees pursuant to Article 2 119 of Chapter 7 of Title 36 and incidental and clerical expenses 120 necessarily incurred in carrying out this chapter. The 121 compensation and expenses shall be paid out of the funds of the board. Reimbursement shall not be made if available funds 122 123 are insufficient for this purpose." Section 4. The Legislature concurs in the 124 125 recommendation of the Sunset Committee as provided in Sections 1, 2, and 3. 126 127 Section 5. This act shall become effective on June 1,

2025.
