8	AN ACT
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10	Relating to the Alabama Sunset Law; to continue the
11	existence and functioning of the State Board of Midwifery
12	until October 1, 2029, with certain modifications; to amend
13	Section 34-19-12, Code of Alabama 1975, to require that a
14	board member resides in and be appointed from each
15	congressional district in this state.
16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
17	Section 1. Pursuant to the Alabama Sunset Law, the
18	Sunset Committee recommends the continuance of the State Board
19	of Midwifery until October 1, 2029, with additional
20	recommendation for statutory change as set out in Section 3.
21	Section 2. The existence and functioning of the State
22	Board of Midwifery, created and functioning pursuant to
23	Sections 34-19-11 to 34-19-21, inclusive, Code of Alabama
24	1975, is continued until October 1, 2029, and those code
25	sections are expressly preserved.
26	Section 3. Section 34-19-12, Code of Alabama 1975, is
27	amended to read as follows:
28	"\$34-19-12



(a) There is created and established a State Board ofMidwifery to implement and administer this chapter.

31 (b) The board shall pay all of its expenses from its 32 own funds and no expenses shall be borne by the State of 33 Alabama from the State General Fund.

34 (c) The board shall consist of seven members appointed 35 by the Governor and subject to confirmation by the Senate, 36 from a list of qualified individuals nominated by the 37 designated organization. Each list shall contain the names of 38 at least two individuals for each position to be filled.

39 (d) The members of the board shall be appointed for 40 staggered initial terms and subsequent terms shall be for a 41 minimum of four years or until his or her successor has been 42 appointed and qualified.

43 (e) The board shall meet at least twice each year,44 conducting its business in person or by electronic methods.

45 (f) The board shall elect one of its members to serve
46 as chair for a two-year term. The chair may not serve
47 consecutive terms.

48 (g) The composition of the board shall be as follows: 49 (1) Four members shall hold a valid certified 50 professional midwife credential from the North American 51 Registry of Midwives. These members shall be appointed from a 52 list of names submitted by the Alabama Birth Coalition or its 53 successor organization. One of these members shall be appointed to an initial term of four years, one to a term of 54 55 three years, and two to a term of two years.

(2) One member shall be a nurse practitioner. This

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member shall be appointed to an initial term of four years. 57 58 (3) One member shall be a licensed certified nurse 59 midwife or registered nurse licensed under Article 5 of 60 Chapter 21. This member shall be appointed from a list submitted by the Alabama Board of Nursing. This member shall 61 62 be appointed to an initial term of three years. 63 (4) One member shall have used midwifery services in 64 the state. This member shall be appointed from a list of names submitted by the Alabama Birth Coalition. This member shall be 65 appointed to an initial term of three years. 66 67 (h) When choosing individuals to be considered by the Governor for appointment to the board, the nominating 68 69 authorities shall strive to assure membership is inclusive and 70 reflects the racial, gender, geographic, urban, rural, and 71 economic diversity of the state. Commencing on June 1, 2025, as the terms of the members serving on the board expire, the 72 73 membership of the board shall be appointed so that one member 74 resides in and is appointed from each congressional district

75 in this state.

(i) All members of the board shall be immune from
individual civil liability while acting within the scope of
their duties as board members, unless conduct is unreasonable.

(j) Vacancies shall be filled by the Governor and
confirmed by the Senate in the same manner as other
appointments are made. In the case of a vacancy, the new
appointee shall serve for the remainder of the unexpired term.

(k) Members of the board shall serve withoutcompensation but shall be allowed travel and per diem expenses



85 at the same rate paid to state employees, to be paid from the 86 funds collected for the administration of this chapter, as 87 funds are available.

(1) The board may employ, subject to the State Merit
System, investigators, inspectors, attorneys, and any other
agents, employees, and assistants as may from time to time be
necessary, and may use any other means necessary to enforce
the provisions of this chapter.

93 (m) (1) A licensed midwife shall file annually with the 94 board the following information on a form prepared by the 95 board and accessible on its website:

a. The total number of births attended by the licensed
midwife in the previous year, including births where the
licensed midwife was assisting another licensed midwife.

b. The number of maternal transfers to a health care
facility from births attended by the licensed midwife,
including instances where the licensed midwife was assisting
another licensed midwife.

103 c. The number of infant transfers to a health care 104 facility from births attended by the licensed midwife, 105 including instances where the licensed midwife was assisting 106 another licensed midwife.

d. The total number of maternal deaths from births
attended by the licensed midwife, including instances where
the licensed midwife was assisting another licensed midwife.

e. The total number of infant deaths from births
attended by the licensed midwife, including instances where
the licensed midwife was assisting another licensed midwife.



(2) The board shall make the information collected under this subsection available to the public in accordance with federal law. (n) The board shall be subject to the Alabama Sunset Law, Chapter 20, Title 41, as an enumerated agency as provided

in Section 41-20-3, and shall have a termination date of October 1, 2021, and every four years thereafter, unless continued pursuant to the Alabama Sunset Law."

Section 4. The Legislature concurs in the recommendation of the Sunset Committee as provided in Sections 1, 2, and 3.

Section 5. This act shall become effective on June 1,2025.
