7	TO BE ENTITLED
8	AN ACT
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10	Relating to the Alabama Sunset Law; to continue the
11	existence and functioning of the Alabama Board of Licensure
12	for Professional Geologists until October 1, 2027, with
13	certain modifications; to amend Sections 34-41-4, Code of
14	Alabama 1975, to require that a board member resides in and be
15	appointed from each congressional district in this state.
16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
17	Section 1. Pursuant to the Alabama Sunset Law, the
18	Sunset Committee recommends the continuance of the Alabama
19	Board of Licensure for Professional Geologists until October
20	1, 2027, with additional recommendation for statutory change
21	as set out in Section 3.
22	Section 2. The existence and functioning of the
23	Alabama Board of Licensure for Professional Geologists,
24	created and functioning pursuant to Sections 34-41-1 to
25	34-41-24, inclusive, Code of Alabama 1975, is continued until
26	October 1, 2027, and those code sections are expressly
27	preserved.
28	Section 3. Section 34-41-4, Code of Alabama 1975, is



29 amended to read as follows:

30 "\$34-41-4

(a) There is created the Alabama Board of Licensure for
Professional Geologists which shall administer and enforce
this chapter.

34 (b) The board shall consist of seven members appointed 35 by the Governor from a list of nominees submitted by the 36 board, or any entity designated by the board. Members of the 37 board, except for the initial board, shall be licensed professional geologists. Whenever possible the membership of 38 39 the board shall be inclusive and reflect the racial, gender, geographic, <u>urban/rural</u> urban, rural, and economic diversity 40 of the state. Commencing on June 1, 2025, as the terms of the 41 42 members serving on the board expire, the membership of the 43 board shall be appointed so that one member resides in and is appointed from each congressional district in this state. 44

(c) Each member of the board shall be a citizen of the United States, a resident of <u>the State of Alabama</u> <u>this state</u> for at least five years immediately preceding appointment, reside in <u>the this</u> state during the term of office, and be at least 25 years of age.

(d) All members of the initial board shall be appointed by the Governor from a list of nominees who shall at the time of their appointment qualify for licensing under this chapter and become duly licensed during their term. Membership of the board shall include at least one representative member from each of the following professional subgroups of geologists: Faculty of the departments of geology at colleges and



57 universities in the State of Alabama this state that grant 58 degrees in the geological sciences; governmental agencies 59 employing geologists; businesses, exclusive of those exempted 60 herein; mining industry; petroleum industry; geotechnical 61 <u>engineering firms; and/or</u> environmental engineering firms; and 62 independent geological consultants.

63 (e) After the establishment of the initial board, all 64 members of the board shall be licensed under this chapter. The 65 term of office of each member of the board shall be three years. Notwithstanding the foregoing, of the first members 66 67 appointed, two shall be appointed for a term of one year, two for terms of two years, and three for terms of three years. No 68 member shall serve more than two consecutive three-year terms, 69 70 without interruption in service of at least three years.

71 (f) Each term on the board shall expire on September 30 of the year in which the term expires. When the term of a 72 73 member expires, the Governor shall appoint a new member or 74 reappoint the current member for a full term under subsections 75 (d) and (e). If a vacancy occurs, within 90 days of the 76 vacancy the Governor shall appoint a replacement to fill the 77 vacancy for the remainder of the unexpired term. Except for 78 the members of the initial board, all appointments and 79 reappointments to the board shall be made by the Governor from 80 a list of nominees submitted by the board, or any entity 81 designated by the board. In appointing members to the board, the Governor shall strive to achieve diversity in race, 82 gender, geography, residence, and economic condition. 83

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(g) The Governor may remove a member of the board only



for neglect of duty, an unexcused failure to attend more than one of the regularly scheduled meetings held in a calendar year during the term in office of the member, malfeasance, violation of this chapter, or conviction of a felony or other crime of moral turpitude.

90 (h) Members of the board shall receive reimbursement 91 for expenses incurred in the performance of duties of one 92 hundred dollars (\$100) per day plus mileage payable at the 93 same rate as paid for state officers and employees for each 94 day of actual attendance at a regular or special meeting of 95 the board.

96 (i) The board may employ the necessary personnel for 97 performance of its functions and fix their compensation. The 98 board may appoint committees to aid in the performance of its 99 functions."

Section 4. The Legislature concurs in the recommendation of the Sunset Committee as provided in Sections 1, 2, and 3.

Section 5. This act shall become effective on June 1, 2025.
