4	Section 41-4-124, Code of Alabama 1975, to further provide				
5	exceptions relating to volunteer fire departments and rescue				
6	squads.				
7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:				
8	Section 1. Section 41-4-124, Code of Alabama 1975, is				
9	amended to read as follows:				
10	"§41-4-124				
11	(a) Except as otherwise provided in this article, all				
12	rights, powers, duties, and authority relating to the				
13	procurement of supplies and services now vested in, or				
14	exercised by, any governmental body under existing law are				
15	transferred to the Chief Procurement Officer.				
16	(b) The following governmental bodies are subject to				
17	this article except as it relates to the purchase of				
18	professional services and the oversight and authority of the				
19	Chief Procurement Officer $_{m{ au}}$ and shall establish and maintain				
20	procurement offices and personnel and adopt rules—as may be				
21	necessary to comply with this article:				
22	(1) All educational and eleemosynary institutions				
23	governed by a board of trustees or other similar governing				
24	body.				
25	(2) The Retirement Systems of Alabama.				
26	(3) The Department of Mental Health.				
27	(c) The Alabama Department of Transportation is subject				
28	to this article except as it relates to the purchase of

29 professional services and shall adopt rules governing the 30 purchase of professional services by the department which are 31 consistent with the principles contained in this article and 32 promote fairness, competition, transparency, integrity, and 33 value in the procurement process.

34 (d) The procurement of any supplies, services, or
35 professional services by a district attorney, volunteer fire
36 <u>department, rescue squad,</u> or sheriff shall be solely governed
37 by Article 3, commencing with Section 41-16-50 of Chapter 16.

(e) The procurement of any supplies or services by a 38 39 legislative agency or judicial agency shall be solely governed by procedures adopted by the Legislative Council for all 40 legislative agencies and by rules adopted by the Supreme Court 41 42 of Alabama for all judicial agencies. The procedures adopted 43 shall be consistent with any applicable requirements of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, and shall be established in 44 45 accordance with the underlying purposes and policies of 46 promoting responsible and efficient use of public funds 47 dedicated and appropriated to the agencies for their use, 48 providing consistency of application of rules and requirements 49 across all agencies within the applicable branch of state 50 government, and promoting fairness, competition, transparency, 51 integrity, and value in the procurement process. In no case 52 may the legislative and judicial departments of the state 53 adopt procedures that conflict with the laws of this state 54 regarding the public disclosure of the use of public funds and 55 the transparency of public expenditures τ or that otherwise 56 conflict with state law regarding public records and public



57 access to those records. Except for the requirement to act in 58 good faith, no other provision of this article shall apply to 59 legislative or judicial agencies; provided, that the 60 legislative and judicial departments may adopt all or any part 61 of this article and its accompanying rules.

62 (f) The procurement of any supplies or services by the 63 Alabama State Port Authority shall be solely governed by 64 procedures adopted by the Board of Directors of the Alabama 65 State Port Authority. The procedures adopted shall be consistent with any applicable requirements of the 66 67 Constitution of Alabama of 2022_{τ} and shall be established in accordance with the underlying purposes and policies of 68 promoting responsible and efficient use of the funds of the 69 70 Alabama State Port Authority, providing consistency of 71 application of rules and requirements across all agencies within the applicable branch of state government, and 72 73 promoting fairness, competition, transparency, integrity, and 74 value in the procurement process. Except for the protection of 75 information otherwise legally considered commercially 76 confidential, sensitive, or of a nature that upon release 77 would harm the competitive advantage of itself or its 78 customers, concessionaires, lessees, or suppliers, the Alabama 79 State Port Authority may not adopt procedures that conflict 80 with the laws of this state regarding the public disclosure of 81 the use of its funds and the transparency of its expenditures, or that otherwise conflict with state law regarding public 82 records and public access to those records. Except as provided 83 84 in this subsection and the requirement to act in good faith,



85	no other provision of this article shall apply to the Alabama
86	State Port Authority; provided, however, that the Alabama
87	State Port Authority may adopt all or any part of this article
88	and its accompanying rules."
89	Section 2. This act shall become effective on October
90	1, 2025.
