4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Under existing law, the state procurement code
6	governs all purchases made by government entities. An
7	exception within the procurement code is made for
8	district attorneys and sheriffs, whose purchases are
9	governed by local competitive bidding laws.
10	This bill would provide that purchases made by
11	volunteer fire departments and rescue squads are
12	excepted from the requirements of the state procurement
13	code and are instead subject to the local competitive
14	bid law requirements.

- 29 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this article, all
 30 rights, powers, duties, and authority relating to the
 31 procurement of supplies and services now vested in, or
 32 exercised by, any governmental body under existing law are
 33 transferred to the Chief Procurement Officer.
 - (b) The following governmental bodies are subject to this article except as it relates to the purchase of professional services and the oversight and authority of the Chief Procurement Officer, and shall establish and maintain procurement offices and personnel and adopt rules as may be necessary to comply with this article:
 - (1) All educational and eleemosynary institutions governed by a board of trustees or other similar governing body.
 - (2) The Retirement Systems of Alabama.
- 44 (3) The Department of Mental Health.

- (c) The Alabama Department of Transportation is subject to this article except as it relates to the purchase of professional services and shall adopt rules governing the purchase of professional services by the department which are consistent with the principles contained in this article and promote fairness, competition, transparency, integrity, and value in the procurement process.
- (d) The procurement of any supplies, services, or professional services by a district attorney, volunteer fire department, rescue squad, or sheriff shall be solely governed by Article 3, commencing with Section 41-16-50 of Chapter 16.
 - (e) The procurement of any supplies or services by a

57 legislative agency or judicial agency shall be solely governed 58 by procedures adopted by the Legislative Council for all 59 legislative agencies and by rules adopted by the Supreme Court 60 of Alabama for all judicial agencies. The procedures adopted shall be consistent with any applicable requirements of the 61 62 Constitution of Alabama of 2022, and shall be established in 63 accordance with the underlying purposes and policies of 64 promoting responsible and efficient use of public funds 65 dedicated and appropriated to the agencies for their use, providing consistency of application of rules and requirements 66 67 across all agencies within the applicable branch of state government, and promoting fairness, competition, transparency, 68 integrity, and value in the procurement process. In no case 69 70 may the legislative and judicial departments of the state 71 adopt procedures that conflict with the laws of this state regarding the public disclosure of the use of public funds and 72 73 the transparency of public expenditures, or that otherwise 74 conflict with state law regarding public records and public 75 access to those records. Except for the requirement to act in 76 good faith, no other provision of this article shall apply to 77 legislative or judicial agencies; provided, that the 78 legislative and judicial departments may adopt all or any part 79 of this article and its accompanying rules. 80 (f) The procurement of any supplies or services by the 81
