4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Under existing law, animals are afforded
6	protections regarding their care in this state.
7	This bill would require certain methods be used
8	to tether or confine a dog.
9	This bill would require certain care be provided
10	to dogs kept outside using one of these methods.
11	This bill would exempt certain persons and
12	activities from these requirements.
13	This bill would also provide a criminal penalty
14	for tethering or confining a dog in violation of this
15	act.

18	A BILL
19	TO BE ENTITLED
20	AN ACT
21	
22	Relating to dogs; to provide methods for tethering and
23	confining dogs; to provide certain standards of care for dogs
24	kept outside; to exempt certain persons and activities; and to
25	provide criminal penalties for violations.
26	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
27	Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as
28	the Alabama Dog Tethering and Outdoor Shelter Act.



- 29 Section 2. (a) A person may not leave or keep a dog
- 30 chained or tethered to a stationary object, including a
- 31 structure, dog house, pole, or tree, or otherwise confined
- 32 unless in accordance with one of the following:
- 33 (1) a. Confined in a secure enclosure that has adequate
- 34 space for exercise depending upon the age, size, breed, and
- 35 weight of the dog.
- 36 b. The secure enclosure shall be constructed with chain
- 37 link or other sturdy material, with all four sides enclosed
- 38 and with a minimum height sufficient to confine the dog.
- 39 (2) Confined in a fully fenced, including
- 40 electronically fenced, or otherwise securely enclosed yard
- 41 where the dog has the ability to run but is unable to leave
- 42 the yard.
- 43 (3) Tethered to a trolley system that satisfies all of
- 44 the following:
- a. The tether is designed for dogs.
- b. The tether does not weigh more than one-eighth of
- 47 the dog's body weight.
- 48 c. The trolley system does not allow the dog to leave
- 49 the property of the owner or keeper.
- 50 d. Only one dog is tethered to each cable run.
- e. The tether is attached to a properly fitting collar
- 52 or harness worn by the dog, with adequate space between the
- 53 collar and the dog's throat.
- f. The tether has a swivel on both ends to minimize
- 55 tangling of the collar.
- g. The tether and cable run are both at least 10 feet



- in length and the cable run is secured at least four feet, but
- not more than seven feet, above ground level.
- h. The length of the tether from the cable run to the
- dog's collar or harness allows continuous access at all times
- to clean water, adequate food, and shelter as described in
- 62 subsection (d).
- i. The trolley system is of an appropriate
- 64 configuration to confine the dog to the property of the owner
- or keeper, prevent the cable run and tether from extending
- over an object or edge that could result in injury or
- 67 strangulation of the dog, and prevent the cable run and tether
- from becoming tangled with other objects or animals.
- (b) Subsection (a) shall not be construed to apply to
- 70 any of the following:
- 71 (1) A licensed veterinary practice that tethers or
- 72 confines a dog in the course of its practice.
- 73 (2) A boarding kennel or public or private animal
- 74 shelter with secure enclosures for the temporary boarding or
- 75 housing of dogs.
- 76 (3) An exhibition, trial, show, contest, or other
- 77 temporary event in which skill, breeding, or stamina of a dog
- 78 is judged or examined.
- 79 (4) A dog that is used or receives training in a lawful
- 80 manner to hunt wildlife.
- 81 (5) The temporary tethering of a dog at any campsite or
- 82 recreation area.
- 83 (6) A licensed grooming shop or facility during the
- 84 grooming of a dog.



- 85 (7) Any emergency circumstance during which tethering a dog is necessary, but not exceeding a period of three hours.
- (c) A logging chain or other line or device not
 designed or intended for tethering a dog, or a choke collar or
 pinch collar, may not be used temporarily or indefinitely to
 tether a dog.
- 91 (d) In addition to any other requirement, a person 92 leaving or keeping a dog confined outside shall provide the 93 dog with access to clean water, adequate food, and shelter 94 that complies with all of the following:
- 95 (1) Allows the dog to remain dry and protected from the 96 elements, including providing shade for the dog and containing 97 adequate bedding for cold weather when necessary.
 - (2) Has a roof, four walls, and a solid floor.
- 99 (3) Is constructed or manufactured of durable materials
 100 and provides adequate ventilation.
- 101 (4) Has adequate space for the dog to stand up, turn 102 around, and extend its limbs.
- 103 (5) Is free from accumulated waste, standing water, and debris.
- 105 (6) Allows the dog unlimited access.

- 106 (e) Nothing in this section shall be construed to do 107 any of the following:
- 108 (1) Subject a dog actively engaged in conduct that is
 109 directly related to the business of shepherding or herding
 110 livestock or cultivating agricultural products to the outdoor
 111 confinement limitations provided by this section.
- 112 (2) Prohibit a person from walking a dog on a handheld





- 113 leash.
- 114 (3) Prohibit a person from tethering a dog near a place
- of business while the person is inside or otherwise
- interacting with the business, subject to the following
- 117 conditions:
- a. The dog is tethered for a reasonable amount of time.
- 119 b. The dog is tethered in a reasonable location near
- 120 the place of business.
- 121 (f) A person who violates this section shall be guilty
- 122 of a Class B misdemeanor.
- 123 Section 3. This act shall become effective on October
- 124 1, 2025.
