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SYNOPSIS:

Under existing law, the Alabama Space Science Exhibit Commission is responsible for the operation, management, and control of the facilities and exhibits of the U.S. Space and Rocket Center in Huntsville.

This bill would rename the Alabama Space Science Exhibit Commission as the U.S. Space and Rocket Center Commission and would provide for the transition.

This bill would provide for the Governor to be an ex officio nonvoting member of the commission and would provide further for terms.

This bill would authorize interested public and private partners to be utilized for the provision of facilities.

This bill would specify that the commission operates outside of the State Treasury.

This bill would provide further for the duties of the commission.

This bill would exempt all historical materials in the custody of the commission from biannual inventory by the Property Inventory Control Division of the State Auditor's office.

This bill would also make nonsubstantive, technical revisions to update the existing code language to current style.

54	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Sections 41-9-430, \*\* of the Code of Alabama

1975, are amended to read as follows:

(a) (1) There is hereby created and established a state

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agency to be known as the Alabama Space Science Exhibit Commission, which shall be a public body corporate with all the powers and privileges of a corporation, for the purpose of providing for and participating in the management and control of facilities to house and display such visual exhibits of space exploration and hardware used therefor as may be made available by the National Aeronautics and Space Administration. Such The facility shall constitute a permanent housing for the national aeronautics and space administration exhibit, which shall be open to the general public and shall be located at a place to be designated and made available in Madison County for a nominal cost through the cooperation of the Department of the Army and other public and private partners, where feasible, or at such other locations as the commission may deem appropriate. (2) a. Commencing on October 1, 2025, the name of the Alabama Space Science Exhibit Commission shall be the U.S. Space and Rocket Center Commission, and all rights, duties, property, real or personal, and all other effects existing in the name of the Alabama Space Science Exhibit Commission, or in any other name by which the commission has been known, shall continue in the name of the U.S. Space and Rocket Center Commission. Any existing or future reference to the Alabama Space Science Exhibit Commission, or any other name by which the commission has been known, in any existing law, contract, or other instrument, shall constitute a reference to the U.S.



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- b. A reasonable transition period for the name change shall be allowed to permit an orderly and cost-effective transition relating particularly to the use of equipment and supplies. All letterhead, business cards, forms, and any other materials in use by the commission containing the name Alabama Space Science Exhibit Commission shall continue to be used by the U.S. Space and Rocket Center Commission until the supplies are exhausted. Replacement supplies shall contain the name of the U.S. Space and Rocket Center Commission.
- (3) The commission is further empowered to provide such
  may do any of the following:
- 97 <u>a. Provide</u> facilities as will be mutually agreed upon
  98 between the commission and the Department of the Army, or
  99 <u>other public and private partners, where feasible</u>, for the
  100 housing and display of army weaponry and mementos of national
  101 defense.

The commission is further empowered to establish 102 103 Establish an energy information and exhibit center in order to 104 provide information to the public on research and development 105 in the field or energy as developed by the National 106 Aeronautics and Space Administration, the Department of the 107 Army, the Energy Research and Development Administration, 108 other federal and state agencies, including universities and 109 colleges, and other public and private sectors engaged in energy related activities. 110

  112 Construct or otherwise acquire, whether by purchase,

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construction, exchange, gift, lease, or otherwise, lodging and other similar facilities, including parking facilities and facilities for meetings, (provided said items are constructed within one mile of the Alabama Space and Rocket Center), for use by visitors to the permanent exhibit of the commission and users of the commission's visitors' center. In connection therewith, the commission may acquire any land or construct or acquire buildings or other improvements and all real and personal properties deemed necessary by the commission for such purpose, whether or not now in existence. The commission may lease to others any such facilities and may also lease lands of the commission on which such the facilities may be constructed and charge and collect rent therefor, and terminate any such lease upon the failure of the lessee to comply with any of the obligations thereof. The commission may also sell, exchange, or convey and grant options to any lessee to acquire any such facilities and may lease lands of the commission on which such the facilities may be constructed whenever the commission shall find any-such action to be in furtherance of the purpose for which the commission was organized."

**"**§41-9-431

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(a) The commission created by Section 41-9-430 shall consist of 18 members, to be appointed by the Governor, who shall be bona fide residents and qualified voters of this state, at least three of whom shall be residents of Madison County. The remaining members of the commission shall be appointed from throughout the state in such manner as to

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provide general statewide representation on the commission,
<pre>but all Governor shall serve as an ex officio nonvoting member</pre>
of the commission whose absence does not affect a quorum. The
Governor shall coordinate his or her appointments to assure
the commission membership is inclusive and reflects the
racial, gender, geographic, urban, rural, and economic
diversity of the state. All members shall be qualified persons
individuals of unquestioned loyalty to this country who are
knowledgeable and interested in national defense and space
exploration and in the promotion of interest in such those
fields. Nine of the original members shall be appointed for
terms of four years, and nine of the original members shall be
appointed for terms of eight years. Thereafter Commencing on
October 1, 2025, as terms expire, all members shall serve for
terms of <pre>cight six</pre> years, with a limit of two full consecutive
terms. Terms served before or being served on October 1, 2025,
do not count toward the two full consecutive term limit. A
member who has served for two full consecutive terms after
October 1, 2025, may not be appointed to any additional terms
for at least six years following the consecutive service. All
members shall serve until their successors are appointed and
qualified, but any member may be removed by the Governor for
just cause. Vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term
in the same manner as original appointments are made. Service
for an unexpired term does not constitute service for a full
term for purposes of term limits.
(b) The <u>first chairman</u> chair of the commission shall be
appointed by the Covernor from among the original appointeds



- Thereafter, each succeeding chairman shall be selected by the other members membership of the commission.

  - (d) Members and employees of the commission shall be reimbursed for actual expenses incurred on behalf of the commission in the development, operation, promotion, and expansion of its commission programs and activities.
  - (e) The commission shall hold at least one annual meeting at the site of the exhibit, and one half one-half of the members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business which may properly come before the commission at any such meeting.

  - (1) To investigate Investigate and select an available site for housing the exhibits, including the surrounding grounds, in cooperation with the Department of the Army and, the community, and other interested public or private partners, taking into consideration all pertinent factors affecting the suitability of such the site;.
  - (2) To acquire Acquire by rent or lease agreement or

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otherwise the necessary housing facilities and to establish, improve, and enlarge the available facility, including providing it the facility with necessary equipment, furnishings, landscaping, and related facilities, including parking areas and ramps, roadways, sewers, curbs, and gutters.

- agreements with the local, state, and federal governments, with agencies of such those governments, including the Department of the Army and the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, with other public or private individuals, corporations, associations, and other organizations as the commission may deem necessary or convenient to carry out the purpose of this article, such contracts and agreements to include leases to private industry.
  - other sources as may be acceptable to the commission under such terms and conditions as may be provided by law and, in order to provide security for the repayment of any such private loans, to pledge such future revenues from admissions and any other sources as may from time to time be necessary or desirable.
  - (5) To issue Issue and sell, subject to the approval of the Governor, interest-bearing general obligation bonds not in excess of \$1,900,000.00 one million nine hundred thousand dollars (\$1,900,000) in principal amount as authorized by constitutional amendment. Such The bonds shall be general obligations of the State of Alabama with full faith and credit

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and taxing power of the state to be pledged to the prompt and faithful payment of the principal of the bonds and the interest thereon. The proceeds from the sale of such the bonds shall be used exclusively for the purpose of paying the expenses incurred in the sale and issuance thereof and for the construction, establishment, improvement, or enlargement and equipment of building facilities and related grounds, including the renewal or replacement of structural parts of such the facility, but not including the purchase of the site for such the facility.

- (6) To issue Issue and sell at any time and from time to time its revenue bonds for the purpose of providing funds to acquire, enlarge, improve, equip, and maintain a facility and for the payment of obligations incurred for such those purposes. The principal and interest on any such revenue bonds shall be payable solely out of the revenues derived from the project +.
- (7) To borrow Borrow money and in evidence of such the borrowing-to issue and sell at any time and from time to time its revenue bonds (in addition to those authorized under subdivisions (5) and (6) hereof) for the purpose of carrying out the commission's power to construct or acquire lodging facilities, as set out in Section 41-9-430, the principal of and interest on which shall be payable solely out of the revenues and receipts derived by the commission from the 250 operation, leasing, or sale of the lodging facilities. The resolution under which such the revenue bonds are authorized to be issued and any mortgage and deed of trust or trust

352	In view of the unique character and complexity of the
353	duties and responsibilities imposed on the commission by this
354	article, it is hereby specifically provided that the
355	commission shall have, in addition to the power and authority
356	enumerated in Section 41-9-432, the right, power and authority
357	to commission may:
358	(1) Develop and institute a program of promotion and
359	advertising of the exhibits and facilities provided for by
360	this article, said. The program of promotion and advertising
361	to shall be conducted by the commission both within and
362	without the state in such manner and to such extent as may be
363	deemed economically advisable and appropriate by the

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(2) Purchase and acquire items of tangible personal
property on a competitive bid basis in the manner prescribed

The provisions of this article shall be construed liberally, it being the purpose to provide in this state appropriate housing facilities for displaying to the general public exhibits of the Department of the Army and of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, in cooperation with public and private partners, if feasible, and for providing for the management and control of that portion of the display furnished and supplied by the National Aeronautics

and Space Administration by such means as may be feasible and agreed upon."

395 Section 2. Sections 36-16-8 and 41-10-303 of the Code 396 of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:

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The Property Inventory Control Division shall establish a control in the following manner of all nonconsumable state personal property not exempt under Section 36-16-11.

(1) The head of each department or agency of the state shall designate one of its employees as property manager for the department or agency. Except for books, the property manager shall make a full and complete inventory of all nonconsumable personal property and certain other items of personal property deemed important or sensitive enough by the Property Inventory Control Division to be included in the inventory of state property of the value of five hundred dollars (\$500) or more owned by the state and used or acquired by the department or agency. The inventory shall show the complete description, manufacturer's serial number, cost price, date of purchase, location, and custodial agency, responsible officer, or employee, and the state property control marking. A copy of the inventory shall be submitted to the Property Inventory Control Division on October 1 and April 1 of each year. Each inventory shall show all property acquired since the date of the last inventory. When any inventory fails to show any property shown on the previous inventory, then a complete explanation accounting for the property or the disposition thereof shall be attached to the

inventory and submitted to the Property Inventory Control
Division. All property managers shall keep at all times in
their files a copy of all inventories submitted to the
Property Inventory Control Division, and the copies shall be
subject to examination by any and all state auditors or
employees of the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts.

- (2) Each property manager shall be the custodian of, and responsible for, all property in his or her department or agency. When any property is entrusted to other employees or officers of the department or agency, the property manager shall require a written receipt of the property so entrusted, which receipt shall be executed by the person receiving the property. In that event, the property manager shall be relieved of responsibility of the property, and the employee or officer of the department or agency shall be responsible for the property.
- (3) No property, except property being transferred to the Department of Archives and History under Section 41-6-10, shall be disposed of, transferred, assigned, or entrusted to any other department, agency, or employee thereof without the written permission of the Director of the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs or the Governor of the State of Alabama or the designee of either of them.
- (4) Biannually, the Property Inventory Control Division shall conduct an inventory of all—such state personal property excluding historical materials in the custody of the Department of Archives and History and historical materials in the custody of the U.S. Space and Rocket Center Commission,



holding every officer or employee strictly accountable for all personal property assigned to his or her custody.

- (5) No later than November 30 of each new fiscal year, the State Auditor shall report in writing to the Governor all losses and missing items of state property valued at more than five hundred dollars (\$500) as revealed by the most recent inventory of state personal property.
- 456 (6) Whenever any property manager ceases for any reason 457 to be the property manager of his or her department or agency, the director of the department or agency shall immediately 458 459 notify in writing the Property Inventory Control Division. The division shall immediately check the inventories of all 460 461 property in the department or agency, and the successor to the 462 property manager shall execute a written receipt for all 463 property received by him or her or coming into his or her 464 custody or control. The last payment of salary due the 465 property manager shall be withheld until a complete check of 466 the inventory of the property has been made and approved. In 467 the event of any shortages, the property manager shall be held 468 strictly accountable. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the 469 property manager shall not be held accountable for property 470 entrusted to any other employee or officer of the department 471 or agency and for which he or she holds the written receipt of the employee or officer." 472

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(a) To become a corporation, the three individuals selected pursuant to Section 41-10-302 hereof shall present to the Secretary of State of Alabama an application signed by



477 them which shall set forth:

- (1) The name and residence of each of the applicants, together with a certified copy of all documents evidencing each applicant's selection by the commission and approval by the Governor:
- 482 (2) The name of the proposed corporation, which shall
  483 <u>initially</u> be the "Alabama Space Science Exhibit Finance
  484 Authority" and, upon proper application filed by the
  485 <u>commission with the Secretary of State, shall be renamed the</u>
  486 "U.S. Space and Rocket Center Finance Authority";
  - (3) The location of the principal office of the proposed corporation; and
  - (4) Any other matter relating to the incorporation of the proposed corporation which the applicants may choose to insert and which is not inconsistent with this article.
  - (b) The application shall be subscribed and sworn to by each of the applicants before an officer authorized by the laws of this state to take acknowledgements to deeds. The Secretary of State shall examine the application, and if he or she finds that it the application substantially complies with the requirements of this section, he or she shall receive and file it the application and record it in an appropriate book of records in his or her office."

Section 3. The Code Commissioner, at times determined appropriate, shall change all references to the Alabama Space Science Exhibit Commission in the Code of Alabama 1975 to the U.S. Space and Rocket Center Commission as provided in Section 41-9-430, Code of Alabama 1975.



Section 4. This act shall become effective on October 1, 2025.
