25 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

26 Section 1. (a) For the purpose of this section, 27 "homeless" has the same meaning as in Section 15-20A-4, Code of Alabama 1975. 28



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- (b) Unless authorized by law, court order, or the
 homeless individual or his or her agent, the state or a
 political subdivision of the state, or a law enforcement
 officer, agent, or employee thereof, when acting in his or her
 official capacity, shall not transport a homeless individual
 to another city or county within the state.
 - (c) Subsection (b) does not apply if the state or a political subdivision of the state or a law enforcement officer, agent, or employee thereof has written consent from an entity in another city or county of this state agreeing to accept homeless individuals, and the entity actually accepts the individuals.
- 41 (d) A violation of this section is a Class A
 42 misdemeanor. A separate violation is committed for each
 43 individual transported.

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Section 2. This act shall become effective on October 1, 2025.
