4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Existing law establishes state holidays.
6	This bill would add Juneteenth as a state
7	holiday and provide that state employees must be given
8	the option to observe either Jefferson Davis' birthday
9	or Juneteenth in accordance with each state agency's
10	policy.
11	This bill would also delete duplicative language
12	and make nonsubstantive, technical revisions to update
13	the existing code language to current style.

20	Relating to state holidays; to amend Section 1-3-8,
21	Code of Alabama 1975, to add Juneteenth as a state holiday and
22	provide that state employees may observe Jefferson Davis'
23	birthday or Juneteenth in accordance with state agency policy;
24	and to delete duplicative language and make nonsubstantive,
25	technical revisions to update the existing code language to
26	current style.
27	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 1-3-8, Code of Alabama 1975, is

31	(a) Sunday, Christmas Day, The following days are
32	official state holidays:
33	(1) New Year's Day, <u>January 1.</u>
34	(2) Martin Luther King, Jr.'s birthday $_{\overline{r}}$ and Robert E.
35	Lee's birthday, the third Monday in January.
36	(3) George Washington's birthday and Thomas
37	Jefferson's birthday, Confederate Memorial Day, National the
38	third Monday in February.
39	(4) Confederate Memorial Day, the fourth Monday in
40	April.
41	(5) Memorial Day, the last Monday in May.
42	(6) Jefferson Davis' birthday, the first Monday in
43	June.
44	(7) Juneteenth, June 19.
45	(8) The Fourth day of July, July 4.
46	(9) Labor Day, the first Monday in September.
47	(10) Columbus Day, and Fraternal Day, and American
48	Indian Heritage Day, the second Monday in October.

54	(b) If any holiday falls on Sunday, the following day
55	is the holiday. If any holiday falls on Saturday, the
56	preceding day is the holiday.

57	(c)(1) All state holidays, except Jefferson Davis'
58	birthday and Juneteenth, shall be observed by the closing of
59	all state offices. In addition, Veterans' Day shall be
60	observed by the closing of all state, county, and municipal
61	offices, all banks located within this state, and the all
62	public K-12 schools, on such day. Public schools, grades K to
63	12, inclusive, and all public two-year institutions of higher
64	education shall also be closed on National Memorial Day, and
65	such closing shall be applicable to all students and
66	non-essential employeesand Memorial Day shall be observed by
67	the closing of all public K-12 schools and all public two-year
68	and four-year institutions of higher education.
69	(2) Notwithstanding subdivision (1), employees shall be
70	given the option to observe either Jefferson Davis' birthday
71	or Juneteenth as a state holiday. Each agency shall establish
72	a policy to implement this subdivision.
73	(d) The Superintendent of Banks, with the concurrence
74	of not less than two members of the state Banking Board, may
75	authorize anythe closure of state bank to close on National
76	Memorial Day, the last Monday in May, banks in observance of
77	any state or federal holiday and on such any other days as may
78	be declared by the Governor to be $\underline{a}$ state $\underline{holidays}$ $\underline{holiday}$ in
79	honor of a special event. If any authorized a state holiday
80	falls on Friday, the Superintendent of Banks may authorize the
81	Saturday following that Friday to be a holiday. The
82	superintendent may also authorize the closing of banks at
83	12:00 noon on the day prior to Christmas Day, and the day
84	prior to New Year's Day, if such days the holidays fall on

106	(c) (e) (1) In addition to the legal state holidays
107	provided above in subsection (a), Mardi Gras shall be deemed a
108	holiday in Mobile and Baldwin and Mobile Counties, and all
109	state offices shall be closed in those counties on Mardi Gras.
110	(d) (2) In addition to the legal holidays provided above
111	all state employees, except All state employees other than
112	those employed in Baldwin and Mobile Counties— shall be

granted one personal leave day per year. The personal leave day shall be granted on January 1 of each year. All state employees employed in Baldwin and Mobile Counties shall be granted no personal leave day. All such personal leave days granted in any year pursuant to this subdivision shall be used by the end of the calendar year. All such personal leave days shall and must be scheduled during the year with the approval of the supervisor. Supervisors failing to schedule personal leave days for employees shall justify that action in writing to the Director of State Personnel and the employee shall receive pay at a rate not less than the employee's usual and customary rate of pay for any personal leave day not taken by December 31 of each year.

(e) (f) (1) All state holidays shall be observed by the closing of all state offices. Any state office may remain open on a state holiday upon written notice by the appointing authority to the State Personnel Board at least 60 days in advance of the holiday. Provided, that In addition, any state office may be opened in the event of an emergency, and the State Personnel Board may grant a blanket approval for the openings opening of state offices needing to be open on holidays on a regular basis for essential services.

(2) Any state employee working on a state holiday shall receive a day of compensatory leave or paid compensation in lieu of the holiday as provided herein.

(f) Each employee shall attempt to schedule any compensatory leave day provided in lieu of a regularly scheduled holiday, subject to the approval of the his or her

- 141 supervisor, during the quarter that the regularly scheduled 142 holiday occurred. If any compensatory leave day cannot be 143 scheduled during the designated quarter, the compensatory 144 leave day may be accumulated at the request of the employee 145 for up to one year. Supervisors failing to schedule 146 compensatory leave days for employees within the quarter, 147 unless the day is carried forward at the request of the 148 employee, shall justify that action in writing to the Director 149 of State Personnel and the employee shall receive pay at a 150 rate not less than the employee's usual and customary rate of 151 pay for any compensatory leave day to which the employee may be entitled and which has not been taken. 152 153 (q)(1) The first day in December of each year is
- 154 designated as Mrs. Rosa L. Parks Day in this state. All 155 citizens of this state are requested to devote some portion of 156 Mrs. Rosa L. Parks Day to commemorate the accomplishments of 157 Mrs. Rosa L. Parks, a woman of great courage, vision, love, 158 and faith who helped usher in the modern civil rights movement 159 on December 1, 1955, by refusing to give up her seat on a bus 160 in Montgomery, Alabama. Each resident of this state is 161 requested to observe the day with appropriate activities.
- 162 (2) Each county and municipality may elect to observe 163 Mrs. Rosa L. Parks Day as a holiday."
- Section 2. This act shall become effective on October 1, 2025.
