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4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Under existing law, children are required to
6	use child passenger restraint systems based on their
7	age and weight. Specifically, children are required to
8	use rear facing car seats until at least one year of
9	age or 20 pounds; are required to use front facing
10	convertible seats until at least five years of age or
11	40 pounds; and are required to use booster seats until
12	at least six years of age.
13	This bill would revise the weight and age
14	ranges for determining the appropriate child restraint
15	system and would increase penalties associated with a
16	violation.

20	TO BE ENTITLED
21	AN ACT
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23	Relating to motor vehicles; to amend Section 32-5-222,
24	Code of Alabama 1975, to further provide for the requirement
25	to use child passenger restraint systems and seatbelts; and to
26	increase penalties for a violation.
27	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
28	Section 1. Section 32-5-222, Code of Alabama 1975, is



29 amended to read as follows:

30 "\$32-5-222

31 (a) Every person transporting a child in a motor 32 vehicle operated on the roadways, streets, or highways of this 33 state τ shall provide for the protection of the child by 34 properly using an aftermarket or integrated child passenger 35 restraint system meeting applicable federal motor vehicle 36 safety standards and the requirements of subsection (b). This 37 section shall not be interpreted to release in part or in whole the responsibility of an automobile manufacturer to 38 39 insure ensure the safety of children to a level at least equivalent to existing federal safety standards for adults. In 40 no event shall failure to wear a child passenger restraint 41 42 system be considered as contributory negligence. The term 43 "motor vehicle" as used in this section shall include a passenger car, pickup truck, van (seating capacity of 10 or 44 45 less), minivan, or sports utility vehicle.

46 (b) The size appropriate restraint system required for
47 a child in subsection (a) must meet the requirements of
48 Section 32-5B-4 and shall include all of the following:

(1) Infant only seats and convertible seats used in the rear facing position for infants until the child is at least one yeartwo years of age or 20 pounds 35 pounds in weight. In the event that a child less than two years of age weighs more than the recommended weight rating for the infant seat, but less than 35 pounds, a convertible seat must be used.

56 forward facing seats until the child is at least five years of

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57	age or 40 pounds 65 pounds in weight.
58	(3) Booster Belt positioning booster seats until the
59	child is at least six years of age and can satisfy all of the
60	following conditions:
61	a. The child is able to sit all the way back against
62	the vehicle seat.
63	b. The child's knees bend comfortably at the edge of
64	the seat.
65	c. The seatbelt crosses the child's shoulder between
66	the neck and arm.
67	d. The lap belt is able to lay flat across the child's
68	upper thighs.
69	e. The child is able to stay seated as described in
70	this subdivision for the entire trip.
71	(4) Seat belts until 15 years of age for every other
72	individual, except as provided under Section 32-5B-4(b).
73	(c) In addition to the requirements of subsection (a)
74	and (b), it is recommended that no child under 13 years of age
75	ride in the front seat of a motor vehicle, and further
76	recommended that the child should ride in the second or third
77	row of the motor vehicle, unless either of the following
78	circumstances exist:
79	(1) The motor vehicle does not have a second row of
80	seats.
81	(2) Circumstances require the child to use the front
82	seat, including when all otherwise available second or third
83	row seats are full or are equipped with a child passenger
84	restraint system not applicable to the child.

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85	<pre>(c) (d) No provision of this This section shall not be</pre>
86	construed as creating to create any duty, standard of care,
87	right, or liability between parent and child that is not
88	recognized under the laws of the State of Alabama as they
89	presently exist, or may, at any time in the future, be
90	constituted by statute or decision.
91	<pre>(d) (e) Any person violating the provisions of this</pre>
92	section shall be required to attend a court hearing on the
93	violation, which may not be waived.
94	(f)(1)a. On a first violation, the person may be fined
95	twenty-five dollars (\$25) for each offense .
96	b. On a second violation within a five-year period, the
97	person shall be fined fifty dollars (\$50).
98	c. On a third violation within a five-year period, the
99	person shall be fined one hundred dollars (\$100).
100	d. On a four or subsequent violation within a five-year
101	period, the person shall be fined one hundred fifty dollars
102	(\$150).
103	(2) The charges Upon a first violation only, the charge
104	may be dismissed by the trial judge hearing the case and no
105	court costs shall be assessed upon proof of acquisition of an
106	appropriate child passenger restraint.
107	(c) (g) Fifteen dollars (\$15) of a fine imposed under
108	subsection $\frac{(d)}{(f)}$ shall be used to distribute vouchers for

109 size appropriate child passenger restraint systems to families 110 of limited income in the state. The fifteen dollars (\$15) 111 shall be deposited in the State Treasury to be distributed by 112 the state Comptroller to the Department of Public Health,

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113 which shall administer the program free of charge. (f) (h) Nothing The provisions of this section 114 115 notwithstanding, nothing contained herein in this section 116 shall be deemed a violation of any law which that would 117 otherwise nullify or change in any way the provisions or 118 coverage of any insurance contract. 119 (g) (i) For the purpose of identifying habitually 120 negligent drivers and habitual or frequent violators, the 121 Department of Public SafetySecretary of the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency shall assess the following points: 122 123 (1) Violation of child safety restraint requirements, first offense1 point. 124 125 (2) Violation of child safety restraint requirements, 126 second or subsequent offense2 points. 127 (h) (j) Every person transporting a child shall be responsible for assuring ensuring that each child is properly 128 129 restrained pursuant to this section. The provisions shall; 130 provided, this subsection does not apply to taxis and allor 131 motor vehicles with a seating capacity of 11 or more 132 passengers.

133 (i) (k) Each state, county, and municipal police 134 department shall maintain statistical information on traffic 135 stops of minorities pursuant to this section, and shall report 136 that information monthly to the Department of Public 137 SafetyAlabama State Law Enforcement Agency and the Office of 138 the Attorney General."

139 Section 2. This act shall become effective on October140 1, 2025.
