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8	Relating to emergency medical transport providers; to
9	amend Sections 40-26B-90 and 40-26B-93, Code of Alabama 1975
10	and Sections 40-26B-91, 40-26B-94, 40-26B-95, and 40-26B-99,
11	Code of Alabama 1975, as last amended by Act 2024-214, 2024
12	Regular Session; to extend the assessment on emergency medical
13	providers through the fiscal quarter ending July 1, 2028.
14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
15	Section 1. Sections 40-26B-90 and 40-26B-93, Code of
16	Alabama 1975, and Sections 40-26B-91, 40-26B-94, 40-26B-95,
17	and 40-26B-99, Code of Alabama 1975, as last amended by Act
18	2024-214, 2024 Regular Session, are amended to read as
19	follows:
20	"§40-26B-90
21	The following words, terms, and phrases, when used in
22	this article have the meanings ascribed to them in this
23	section, except where the context clearly indicates a
24	different meaning:
25	(1) ASSESSMENT POOL. The total assessments collected
26	pursuant to this article as of a date determined by the
27	Commissioner of Alabama Medicaid, which date shall be no later
28	than the 60th day of a fiscal quarter, that have not been



- expended for the purposes of this article, net of the amounts specified in subdivision (c)(1) of Section 40-26B-93, plus any Medicaid federal financial participation.
- 32 (2) ASSESSMENT RATE. A monetary amount per emergency
 33 medical transport applied to calculate emergency medical
 34 transport assessments pursuant to this article.
- 35 (3) DEPARTMENT. The Department of Revenue of the State of Alabama.
- 37 (4) EMERGENCY MEDICAL TRANSPORT. The act of transporting an individual from any point of origin to the 38 39 nearest medical facility capable of meeting the emergency medical needs of the patient by an ambulance licensed, 40 41 operated, and equipped in accordance with applicable state or 42 local statutes, ordinances, or regulations. This term shall 43 only include services that are billable utilizing Healthcare 44 Common Procedure Coding System (HCPCS) emergency transport 45 codes A0429 BLS Emergency, A0427 ALS Emergency (Level 1), 46 A0433 ALS Emergency (Level 2), A0434 Specialty Care Transport, 47 and A0225 Neonatal Emergency Transport. In consultation with 48 the Alabama Medicaid Agency, the Department may include 49 additional HCPCS Codes when approved by the federal 50 government. "Emergency medical transports" This term shall not 51 include transportation of beneficiaries by passenger cars, taxicabs, litter vans, wheelchair vans, or other forms of 52 53 public or private conveyances, nor shall it include 54 transportation by an air ambulance provider or a transport not paid by any payor. 55
 - (5) EMERGENCY MEDICAL TRANSPORT ENHANCEMENT. An



- additional Medicaid payment to emergency medical transport providers authorized by Section 40-26B-95.
- (6) EMERGENCY MEDICAL TRANSPORT PROVIDER. A provider of
- 60 emergency medical transports licensed by the Alabama
- Department of Public Health's Office of Emergency Medical
- 62 Services as a transport provider. The term "emergency medical
- transport provider" includes both public and private
- 64 providers.
- (7) FISCAL QUARTER. A state fiscal quarter within a
- 66 state fiscal year.
- 67 (8) FISCAL YEAR. An accounting period of 12 months
- 68 beginning on the first day of the first month of the state
- 69 fiscal year.
- 70 (9) GROSS RECEIPTS. Gross payments received as patient
- 71 care revenue for emergency medical transports, determined on a
- 72 cash basis of accounting.
- 73 (10) MEDICAID PROGRAM. The medical assistance program
- as established in Title XIX of the Social Security Act and as
- 75 administered in the State of Alabama by the Alabama Medicaid
- 76 Agency pursuant to executive order and Title 560 of the
- 77 Alabama Administrative Code.
- 78 (11) TRANSPORT ENHANCEMENT RATE. An additional Medicaid
- 79 payment per emergency medical transport authorized pursuant to
- 80 this article."

- To provide further for the availability of indigent
- 83 health care, the operation of the Medicaid Program, and the
- 84 maintenance and expansion of emergency medical transport



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- (1) Commencing no later than the fiscal quarter starting April 1, 2023, and through and including the fiscal quarter starting July 1, 20252028, an assessment is imposed on each emergency medical transport provider based on the number of emergency medical transports. The quarterly assessment for each emergency medical transport provider shall be calculated based on the product of the assessment rate and the total number of revenue received from emergency medical transports rendered by the emergency medical transport provider from the previous fiscal quarter.
- (2) In consultation with the Alabama Medicaid Agency, 96 97 the department shall calculate the assessment rate by 98 multiplying the projected total gross receipts for all 99 emergency medical transport providers for a fiscal year by 5.3 percent, which resulting product shall be divided by the 100 projected total annual number of emergency medical transports 101 by all emergency medical transport providers for the fiscal 102 103 year set an assessment rate each fiscal quarter. The 104 assessment rate shall be a maximum of 5.3 percent, subject to 105 Section 40-26B-98(b). In no case shall the proportion of 106 assessments collected under this article divided by total 107 gross receipts, expressed as a percentage, exceed half a 108 percent less than the maximum percentage of the annual 109 aggregate net patient revenue for emergency medical transport providers that is prescribed pursuant to federal law and 110 regulations. In consultation with the Alabama Medicaid Agency, 111 112 the department may change the assessment rate each quarter to



- reduce the amount of surplus assessments. Any surplus
 assessment from a previous quarter may be used to reduce the
 assessment rate.
- 116 (3) The assessment imposed by this article is in

 117 addition to all other taxes and assessments of any kind now

 118 imposed by law."

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- 120 (a) The assessment imposed by this article shall be due 121 and payable to the department on a date determined by the department, which date shall not be later than the 30th day of 122 123 the fiscal quarter for which the assessment is assessed, except that Section 40-26B-97 shall apply to any fiscal 124 125 quarter for which federal approval has not been obtained as of 126 the first day of the fiscal quarter. Any payment not received 127 by the 30th day shall be considered delinquent. When collected, the assessment imposed by the article shall be 128 129 deposited to the Alabama Health Care Trust Fund.
 - (b) Any emergency medical transport provider that fails to pay the assessment levied by this article by the 30th day of the fiscal quarter for which the assessment is assessed within the time required by the department shall pay, in addition to the assessment, a penalty of 10 percent of the amount of the assessment due, together with interest thereon at the rate prescribed by Section 40-1-44, such penalty and interest to be assessed and collected as part of the assessment. Provided, however, the department, if a good and sufficient reason is shown, may waive or remit the penalty of 10 percent or a portion thereof. If the delinquent payment is



141	not received by the 45th day of the quarter in which the
142	assessment was due, the department shall notify the Alabama
143	Medicaid Agency which shall determine whether the emergency
144	medical transport provider is a Medicaid provider, and if so,
145	shall withhold the payment, interest, and penalty due from any
146	reimbursement due the provider under the Medicaid Program,
147	including any emergency medical transport enhancements
148	authorized by Section 40-26B-95. Any emergency medical
149	transport provider who submits a delinquent payment shall not
150	be eligible for medical transport enhancements authorized by
151	Section 40-26B-95 during that quarter. Delinquent payments
152	shall be considered a part of the surplus assessment to be
153	utilized in accordance with Section 40-26B-91. The assessments
154	levied by this article shall constitute a debt due the State
155	of Alabama and may be collected by civil action in addition to
156	the methods provided in this article.
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(c) Revenues generated by this assessment shall be made available exclusively and are continuously appropriated for the following purposes:

- (1) To pay for the state's administrative costs of this article, the department shall receive one percent of the assessment per quarter and Medicaid shall receive funding for expenses and enhancements to health care services with emphasis on non-emergency transportation in an amount of one hundred seventy-five thousand dollars (\$175,000) per fiscal quarter, subject to subsection (d) of Section 40-26B-98.
- (2) To pay emergency medical transport enhancements to emergency transport providers pursuant to Section 40-26B-95."

- 170 (a) Commencing no later than the fiscal quarter 171 starting April 1, 2023, and through and including the fiscal 172 quarter starting July 1, 20252028, on or before the 15th day 173 after the close of each fiscal quarter, every emergency 174 medical transport provider shall file with the department a 175 statement under penalty of perjury on forms prescribed by the 176 department, showing the total number of emergency medical 177 transports, the total amount of gross receipts for the subject fiscal quarter, and other reasonable and necessary information 178 179 as the department, after consultation with the Alabama Medicaid Agency and adoption of appropriate rules, may require 180 181 for the proper enforcement of this article.
- 182 (b) It shall be the duty of each emergency medical 183 transport provider to keep and preserve suitable books and 184 records as may be necessary to determine the amount of assessments for which it is liable under this article. The 185 186 books and records shall be kept and preserved for a period of 187 not less than three years, and all such books and records 188 shall be open for examination during business hours by the 189 department or its duly authorized agents.
- (c) All information secured pursuant to this article by
 the department shall be confidential, as prescribed by Section
 40-2A-10, except that the department may provide such
 information to the Alabama Medicaid Agency as necessary for
 the proper administration of the Medicaid Program, or for the
 department's proper administration of the assessment levied by
 this article.



197 (d) The department shall from time to time, as it deems
198 desirable, adopt reasonable rules as necessary to provide for
199 the orderly and efficient administration of the assessment
200 levied by this article."

- 202 (a) Commencing no later than the fiscal quarter 203 starting April 1, 2023, and through and including the fiscal 204 quarter starting July 1, 20252028, the Alabama Medicaid Agency 205 shall pay an emergency medical transport enhancement each 206 fiscal quarter to emergency medical transport providers as set 207 forth in this section on or before the last day of the quarter, except that Section 40-26B-97 shall apply to any 208 209 fiscal quarter for which federal approval has not been 210 obtained as of the first day of the fiscal quarter. The 211 emergency medical transport enhancement shall be paid in addition to any other amounts payable to emergency medical 212 213 transport providers with respect to those services and shall 214 not affect any other payments to emergency medical transport providers. 215
- 216 (b) For each fiscal quarter, the emergency medical 217 transport enhancement to each emergency medical transport 218 provider shall be calculated as the total number of emergency 219 medical transports reimbursed by the Alabama Medicaid Agency 220 as the primary payor in accordance with Chapter 8 of the 221 Medicaid Provider Manual to the emergency medical transport provider in the preceding fiscal quarter multiplied by the 222 transport enhancement rate. The total emergency medical 223 224 transport enhancement to all providers shall not be great than



the assessment pool.

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(c) For each fiscal quarter, the Alabama Medicaid

Agency shall establish the transport enhancement rate based on
the assessment pool divided by the total number of emergency
medical transports reimbursed by the Alabama Medicaid Agency
as the primary payor to all emergency medical transport


providers in the preceding fiscal quarter difference between
the Medicaid rate for each emergency medical transport and the
average rate paid by commercial insurers."

- 235 (a) This article shall cease to be operative on the 236 first day of the fiscal quarter beginning on or after the date 237 one or more of the following conditions is satisfied:
- 238 (1) Federal financial participation under Title XIX of
 239 the Social Security Act is not available to the Alabama
 240 Medicaid Program for the purposes of this article at the
 241 approved federal medical assistance percentage, established
 242 under Section 1905 of the Social Security Act, 42 U.S.C. §
 243 1396d, for the applicable fiscal quarter.
- 244 (2) The state ceases to meet its obligation for the 245 level of state funding not derived from the assessment 246 established by this article as described in Section 247 40-26B-96(b).
- 248 (b) On the earlier of the occurrence of one or more of
 249 the conditions listed in subsection (a) is satisfied on
 250 December 1 of each year, 2024, the department shall refund any
 251 remaining assessment pool to each provider of ground emergency
 252 medical transport services in proportion to the amount paid by



253	the respective provider during the most recently completed
254	quarterly payment period."
255	Section 2. This act shall become effective on June 1,
256	2025
