1 2 3 4 SYNOPSIS: 5 This bill makes appropriations for the ordinary expenses of the executive, legislative, and judicial 6 agencies of the State, for other functions of 7 8 government, for debt service, and for capital outlay 9 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2026. 10 11 12 A BILL 13 TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT 14 15 To make appropriations for the ordinary expenses of the executive, legislative, and judicial agencies of the State, 16 for other functions of government, for debt service, and for 17 capital outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2026. 18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 19 20 Section 1. The monies in Section 3 are appropriated from the named funds for the 2026 fiscal year to the state 21 22 agencies indicated, as the amounts to be used to pay the expenditures of the named agencies, and are in lieu of all 23 monies appropriated for these purposes in other sections of 24 25 the Alabama Statutes.

For the purpose of this act, the amounts herein for

- 28 for all programs are shown by the source of funds. It is
- 29 intended that only the herein named funds be appropriated in
- 30 the amounts specified to the named agencies and that the
- 31 following definitions shall be applicable.
- "Total" shall mean the aggregate total appropriation of
- 33 all funding sources.
- 34 "Program" shall mean specific governmental services
- 35 required to achieve a specific objective. A program shall be
- 36 directed to meeting the need of an identified clientele, or
- 37 group of recipients or beneficiaries, and shall be expended
- 38 only for such purposes.
- "Capital Outlay" shall mean expenditures which result
- 40 in the acquisition and/or addition to items, such as land or
- 41 buildings, which have an appreciable and calculable period of
- 42 usefulness in excess of one year, and shall be expended only
- 43 for such purposes.
- "Debt Service" shall mean an expenditure for the
- 45 payment of interest and principal on bonded debt obligations
- of the State, and shall be expended only for such purposes.
- 47 "Federal and Local Funds" shall mean all gifts, grants,
- 48 contributions, or entitlements, including grants by the
- 49 Congress of the United States, municipalities or counties.
- 50 Section 2. (a) There is hereby appropriated the amounts
- 51 set forth herein for the ordinary expenses of the executive,
- 52 legislative, and judicial agencies of the State, for other
- 53 functions of government, for debt service, and for capital
- outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2026, to be

- 55 paid out of any monies hereinafter specified, from such other 56 funds and accounts as may be designated, or so much thereof as 57 may be necessary, and the total amount to be expended for the 58 items for which the appropriation is herein made shall not 59 exceed the amount provided therefor, except as provided in the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 41-19-1 through 60 61 41-19-12, Code of Alabama 1975. Provided, however, that 62 regardless of the ending date of any pay period which has been 63 or may be established by the Legislature for the payment of 64 salaries of state employees, the entire payment due shall be made from the fiscal year's appropriation in which the pay 65 66 date falls. 67 (b) All appropriations made in Section 3 shall be at
- the program level. Any directed expenditure of funds below a program shall be from funds appropriated for the program.

All encumbered balances of a previous fiscal year appropriation, other than the exclusions authorized by this act or in Section 41-4-93, Code of Alabama 1975, shall lapse no later than September 30 of the fiscal year immediately following the fiscal year for which the appropriation was made and shall revert to the credit of the State General Fund or earmarked fund from which the appropriation or appropriations were made.

Section 16. The appropriations made herein to the

All funds collected under Section 3359 40-12-43.1, Code of Alabama 1975, between the effective date of Act 98-191 and September 30, 2025, are hereby appropriated 3360 3361 to the Auburn University Center for Governmental Services for the administration of the examiner certification program 3362 3363 established by the Alabama Local Tax Institute of Standards 3364 and Training as provided in Section 40-12-43.1, Code of Alabama 1975. 3365 Section 18. It is the intent of the Legislature that 3366 3367 the funds appropriated to the Office of the Senate President Pro Tempore in subsection 6 of Section 3 of this act which are 3368 3369 not otherwise designated may be expended by the Senate 3370 President Pro Tempore for the same purposes as are authorized 3371 for the Lieutenant Governor pursuant to Section 29-4-50, Code 3372 of Alabama 1975, and the Speaker of the House of 3373 Representatives pursuant to Section 29-4-60, Code of Alabama 3374 1975.
